- 4 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to adopt
- 5 multiple provisions related to improving the agricultural economy. The bill
- 6 would require the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets (Agency) to
- 7 evaluate an Agricultural Loan Loss Reserve Fund to serve as credit
- 8 enhancement for farmers and forest products businesses. The bill would
- 9 appropriate additional funds to the Working Lands Program. The bill would
- enact a limitation on liability for agritourism activity. The bill would require
- the Agency to report to the General Assembly regarding the prioritization and
- 12 potential funding sources for additional farm and food business service
- providers needed to support the agricultural industry in Vermont. The bill
- would require the creation of a directory of legal and financial service
- providers who provide services or expertise needed by working lands
- businesses. The bill would appropriate funds for a grant to support the
- statewide direct market electronic benefit transfer doubling programs. The bill
- would appropriate funds to the Agency for a grant to establish and implement a
- 19 hemp trade association in the State.

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	* * * Working Lands Program * * *
3	Sec. 1. APPROPRIATIONS; WORKING LANDS PROGRAM
4	In fiscal year 2021, in addition to the \$1,300,000.00 otherwise appropriated
5	to the program, \$200,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund to the
6	Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets for grants to be awarded through the
7	Vermont Working Lands program, pursuant to 6 V.S.A. chapter 207,
8	subchapter 2.
9	* * * Agricultural Loan Reserve Fund * * *
10	Sec. 2. AGRICULTURAL LOAN LOSS RESERVE FUND
11	The Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets, in consultation with the
12	Vermont Sustainable Jobs Fund, the Vermont Economic Development
13	Authority, and other interested parties, shall evaluate the potential to create an
14	Agricultural Loan Loss Reserve Fund in the State to serve as credit
15	enhancement for farmers and forest products businesses that cannot obtain
16	financing due to lack of collateral or other financing restrictions. On or before
17	January 15, 2021, the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets shall submit
18	to the House Committee on Agriculture and Forestry and the Senate
19	Committee on Agriculture a proposal for establishing an Agricultural
20	Resources Fund in the State. The proposal shall:

1	(1) identify a financial lender or lenders or other institution that would
2	administer the Fund;
3	(2) recommend criteria for use of the Fund by a lender, including
4	whether the Fund would be available to buy down interest rates on loans or
5	pay, in whole or in part, for defaults on loans and forest products; and
6	(3) estimate the amount funds necessary to capitalize the Fund,
7	including the proposed source of the funds.
8	* * * Agritourism; Limitation on Liability * * *
9	Sec. 3. 12 V.S.A. Chapter 212 is added to read:
10	CHAPTER 212. LIMITATION ON LIABILITY FOR AGRITOURISM
11	<u>ACTIVITY</u>
12	§ 5871. DEFINITIONS
13	As used in this chapter:
14	(1)(A) "Agritourism activity" means an interactive or passive activity
15	that is:
16	(i) carried out with or without payment to an agritourism host on a
17	farm regulated under 6 V.S.A. chapter 215, related to farming, food
18	production, historic tradition, or nature watching; and
19	(ii) conducted by an agritourism host for the education,
20	entertainment, or recreation of participants.

1	(B) "Agritourism activity" includes a farming activity; the viewing of
2	a historic, cultural, or natural attraction; a pick-your-own activity; nature
3	watching; and an activity involving an animal exhibition at an agricultural fair.
4	(C) "Agritourism activity" does not include a roadside farm stand or
5	operation exclusively devoted to the sale of merchandise or food at retail.
6	(2) "Agritourism host" means a person who provides the facilities and
7	equipment necessary to participate in an agritourism activity.
8	(3) "Farm" means a parcel or parcels of land owned, leased, or managed
9	by a person and devoted primarily to farming that meets the threshold criteria
10	established by the Required Agricultural Practices.
11	(4) "Farming" has the same meaning as in 10 V.S.A. § 6001.
12	(5) "Inherent risk" means any danger or condition that is an integral part
13	of, or arises from, an agritourism activity, including:
14	(A) the propensity of a wild animal or domestic animal to behave in
15	ways that may result in injury or death to persons on or near the wild animal or
16	domestic animal;
17	(B) a hazard such as a surface or subsurface condition;
18	(C) a natural condition of land, vegetation, or waters;
19	(D) the ordinary dangers of structures or equipment used in farming;
20	<u>and</u>

1	(E) the potential of a participant to act in a negligent way that may
2	contribute to injury or death to the participant or others, such as failing to
3	follow safety procedures or failing to act with reasonable caution while
4	engaging in an agritourism activity.
5	(6) "Participant" means any person who is invited onto the farm for the
6	purpose of participating in an agritourism activity.
7	§ 5872. LIMITATION ON DUTY TO PROTECT
8	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an agritourism host
9	shall not have a legal duty to protect a participant from the inherent risks of an
10	agritourism activity and shall not be liable for injury to or death of a participant
11	resulting from the inherent risks of an agritourism activity, provided that the
12	agritourism host posts the warning required under section 5873 of this title.
13	(b) Nothing in subsection (a) of this section shall limit the liability of an
14	agritourism host who:
15	(1) commits an act or omission of gross negligence concerning the
16	safety of a participant that proximately causes injury or death to the
17	participant;
18	(2) has actual knowledge of:
19	(A) a dangerous condition on the land, facilities, or equipment used
20	in the activity, or

1	(B) the dangerous propensity of an animal used in the activity, which
2	proximately causes injury or death to the participant, and does not make that
3	danger known to the participant;
4	(3) intentionally injures a participant; or
5	(4) commits any other act, error, or omission that constitutes willful or
6	wanton misconduct, gross negligence, or criminal conduct that proximately
7	causes injury or death to the participant.
8	(c) Any limitation on liability afforded by this section to an agritourism
9	host is in addition to any other limitations on liability otherwise provided by
10	<u>law.</u>
11	§ 5873. WARNING NOTICE; POSTING; CONTRACTS
12	(a) An agritourism host shall post and maintain a sign in a clearly visible
13	location at or near the main entrance to each agritourism activity and in black
14	letters at least one inch in height containing the warning notice specified in
15	subsection (c) of this section.
16	(b) Every written contract entered into between an agritourism host and a
17	participant for goods or services related to an agritourism activity shall contain
18	in clearly visible print the warning notice specified in subsection (c) of this
19	section.
20	(c) The warning notice required under subsections (a) and (b) of this
21	section shall read: "WARNING: Under Vermont law, an agritourism host is

1	not liable for the injury or death of a participant in an agritourism activity
2	resulting from the inherent risk of the agritourism activity. Inherent risks
3	include the risk of animals, weather, land conditions, and the potential for you
4	as a participant to act in a negligent way that may contribute to your own
5	injury or death. You are assuming the risk of participating in this agritourism
6	activity."
7	(d) Failure to comply with the requirements of this section shall result in
8	the agritourism host being unable to invoke the limitation on liability provided
9	in section 5872 of this title.
10	* * * Farm and Food Business Service Providers * * *
11	Sec. 4. FARM AND FOOD BUSINESS SERVICE PROVIDERS; REPORT
12	On or before November 15, 2020, the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and
13	Markets shall submit to the House Committee on Agriculture and Forestry and
14	the Senate Committee on Agriculture a report regarding the prioritization and
15	potential funding sources for additional farm and food business service
16	providers identified in the 2020 Agriculture Strategic Plan Report as necessary
17	to support the agricultural industry in Vermont. In developing the report, the
18	Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets shall consult with the Vermont
19	Sustainable Jobs Fund and the Vermont Farm and Forest Viability Program
20	and shall meet with relevant stakeholders.

2	Sec. 5. CREATION OF DIRECTORY OF LEGAL AND FINANCIAL
3	SERVICE PROVIDERS FOR WORKING LANDS BUSINESSES;
4	APPROPRIATIONS
5	(a) On or before January 15, 2021, the Vermont Sustainable Jobs Funds, in
6	collaboration with the Vermont Farm and Forest Viability Program and other
7	relevant stakeholders, shall develop a directory of legal and financial service
8	providers, such as estate and corporate attorneys, accountants, or bookkeepers,
9	who could provide services or expertise needed by working lands businesses in
10	the State. The directory shall include:
11	(1) a listing of qualified legal and financial service providers in the State
12	that have expertise that is relevant to the needs of working lands businesses;
13	<u>and</u>
14	(2) a statement that provides a transparent accounting of how the
15	directory was developed and how relevant legal or financial service providers
16	can be listed in the directory.
17	(b) On or before January 15, 2021, the Vermont Sustainable Jobs Fund
18	shall submit to the House Committee on Agriculture and Forestry and the
19	Senate Committee on Agriculture, a report that:
20	(1) proposes an entity to maintain the directory;
21	(2) estimates the annual cost to operate and update the directory; and

1	(3) summarizes whom the directory will be available to and how it will
2	be accessed and disseminated.
3	(c) In fiscal year 2021, \$15,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund
4	to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets for a grant to the Vermont
5	Sustainable Jobs Fund to assemble the contents of the directory required under
6	subsection (a) of this section.

8	Sec. 6. APPROPRIATIONS; NOFA DIRECT MARKET EBT
9	In fiscal year 2021, \$43,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund to the
10	Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets for a grant to the Northeast Organic
11	Farming Association-VT to support the statewide direct market electronic
12	benefit transfer doubling programs.
13	* * * Hemp Trade Association * * *
14	Sec. 7. APPROPRIATIONS; HEMP TRADE ASSOCIATION
15	In fiscal year 2021, \$25,000.00 is appropriated to the Agency of
16	Agriculture, Food and Markets for a grant to establish and implement a hemp
17	trade association in the State to provide information, market access, education,
18	and regulatory and policy assistance to persons cultivating hemp in the State.
