10	The purpose of this act is to appropriate \$111,130,100.00 from the State's	
11	Coronavirus Relief Fund for necessary expenses incurred as a result of the	
12	COVID-19 public health emergency. This appropriation shall be allocated as	
13	follows: \$43,068,500.00 for broadband connectivity and other initiatives and	
14	\$68,061,600.00 for housing initiatives.	
15	Second: By inserting a Sec. 11a after Sec. 11, COVID-19 response;	
16	housing, to read as follows:	
17	Sec. 11a. HOUSING, RENTAL ASSISTANCE, AND SUPPORT	
18	SERVICES; CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND; APPROPRIATION	
19	(a) The sum of \$16,061,600.00 is appropriated from the Coronavirus Relief	
20	Fund to the Department for Children and Families in fiscal year 2021 to fund	
21	programs and services that support safe, stable housing opportunities for	

1	Vermont households experiencing homelessness as a result of the COVID-19	
2	public health emergency and related administrative costs. The programs and	
3	services funded by this appropriation may include:	
4	(1) expanding the Vermont Rental Subsidy program to provide homeless	
5	households with temporary rental assistance through December 30, 2020 as a	
6	bridge to public housing vouchers;	
7	(2) providing or arranging for housing navigation and case management	
8	services, such as identifying housing barriers, needs, and preferences;	
9	developing and implementing plans to find and secure housing; conducting	
10	outreach to potential landlords; assisting with relocation logistics; developing	
11	permanent housing support crisis plans; and identifying other services	
12	necessary for households to maintain permanent housing;	
13	(3) providing financial assistance to Vermont households who are living	
14	in motels to help them rapidly resolve their homelessness and enter into safe	
15	housing arrangements;	
16	(4) supplementing the General Assistance motel voucher program to	
17	address the immediate housing needs of households who are currently living in	
18	motels or hotels around the State and whose motel or hotel lodging is related to	
19	a disruption to their previous housing situation as a result of the COVID-19	
20	public health emergency; and	

1	(5) capitalizing a housing risk pool for landlords to encourage rentals to		
2	individuals experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity, which would		
3	help landlords lessen their risk of exposure to financial loss through December		
4	20, 2020, while renting to households that have poor or no rental housing		
5	history as result of financial hardship due to the COVID-19 public health		
6	emergency.		
7	(b) The General Assembly determines that the expenditure of monies from		
8	the Coronavirus Relief Fund as set forth in this section is necessary to secure		
9	safe, stable housing opportunities for Vermont households experiencing		
10	homelessness, many of whom have been disproportionately impacted by		
11	unemployment, business closures, or business interruptions as a result of the		
12	COVID-19 public health emergency. The number of households living in		
13	State-supported motels or hotels grew from approximately 300 to 1,400 over		
14	the course of two months. The COVID-19 pandemic has rendered housing in		
15	shelters incompatible with maintaining public health; increased the number of		
16	households experiencing homelessness and in need of housing supports to		
17	obtain or maintain safe, stable housing; and created a demand for diverse social		
18	services to safely house these vulnerable Vermonters.		
19	(c) The provision of housing programs and services is not compensable		
20	under this section to the extent that the same costs or expenses have been or		
21	will be covered by other federal funds.
