4	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to provide
5	additional CARES Act relief to Vermont businesses that have suffered
6	economic harm due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.
7	An act relating to providing additional COVID-19 relief
8	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
9	Sec. 1. 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 137, Sec. 6 is amended to read:
10	Sec. 6. COVID-19; ECONOMIC SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES
11	AND INDIVIDUALS
12	(a) Appropriations; grants. The following amounts are appropriated from
13	the Coronavirus Relief Fund to the named recipients to provide grants to
14	businesses that have suffered economic harm due to the COVID-19 public
15	health emergency and economic crisis.
16	(1) \$82,000,000.00 for additional emergency economic recovery grants
17	pursuant to 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350), Secs. 2-3
18	\$155,000,000.00 for grants to businesses that meet the eligibility criteria in
19	subsection (c) of this section as follows:

1	(A) $\$56,000,000.00$ $\$124,000,000.00$ to the Agency of Commerce
2	and Community Development.
3	(B) \$26,000,000.00 to the Department of Taxes.
4	* * *
5	(5) \$5,000,000.00 to the Agency of Commerce and Community
6	Development to grant to the Vermont Arts Council for grants to nonprofit arts
7	and cultural organizations. For purposes of calculating reduction in revenue
8	under this subdivision, "revenue" does not include tax deductible charitable
9	contributions.

11	(c) Eligibility; grant amount; terms; guidelines.
12	(1) To be eligible for a grant under subsection (a) or (b) of this section, a
13	business must meet the following eligibility criteria and comply with the
14	guidelines adopted pursuant to 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350) unless
15	otherwise provided in this section, except that a business must demonstrate that
16	it suffered a 50 percent or greater reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19
17	public health emergency and economic crisis in a monthly or quarterly period
18	from March 1, 2020 to September 1, 2020 as compared to the same period in
19	2019 subdivision (4) of this subsection:
20	(A) The business is a private, for-profit or nonprofit organization that
21	is domiciled or has its primary place of business in Vermont.

1	(B) The business is either open at the time of application or is closed
2	due to the COVID-19 public health emergency but has a good-faith plan for
3	reopening.
4	(C) The business demonstrates need based on economic loss due to
5	the COVID-19 public health emergency from March 1, 2020 to December 1,
6	<u>2020.</u>
7	(2)(A)(i) The Agency shall establish standards and criteria for
8	determining the amount of grant awards to prioritize applicants based on their
9	financial needs and shall distribute all grants prior to December 20, 2020.
10	(ii) The Agency shall establish an application process with
11	appropriate deadlines for accepting and approving applications and shall
12	disburse funds after all applications have been processed based on
13	demonstrated need and not based on a first-come, first-served basis.
14	(B)(i) Notwithstanding subdivision (2)(A) of this subsection, the
15	Agency shall reserve not more than \$10,000,000.00 for "Critical Need Grants"
16	that shall be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis for applicants who
17	are imminently at risk of closing without grant assistance.
18	(ii) Critical Need Grants are available to applicants who
19	demonstrate that they are at risk of closing without immediate grant support
20	and cannot remain in business if required to wait for the disbursement of other
21	grants after the application period has closed.

1	(iii) Any funds reserved pursuant to this subdivision (2)(B) that
2	are not distributed by November 15, 2020 shall revert for distribution to other
3	applicants.
4	(3) The Agency shall consider whether and by how much grant awards
5	should be adjusted based on whether an applicant has received financial
6	assistance from other sources.
7	(4) The Agency shall adopt and publish guidelines governing the
8	implementation of this section and may coordinate with local, regional, and
9	State economic development partners to administer grants pursuant to this
10	section, including Vermont-based credit unions and banks to process
11	applications based upon the criteria established to determine the actual need of
12	an applicant.

14	(e) Prohibition on multiple sources of funding.
15	(1) A business may not receive a grant of Coronavirus Relief Fund
16	monies from more than one source, except that a business in the dairy sector
17	may apply for a grant under subdivision (a)(2)(B) of this section, provided that
18	the award is not for the same purpose covered under other assistance from the
19	Fund.

1	(g) Emergency economic recovery grant funds; transfer. If any funds
2	appropriated to Agency of Commerce and Community Development and the
3	Department of Taxes in 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350) remain both
4	unencumbered and unspent as of August 1, 2020, the Agency and Department
5	shall combine and administer those funds with the amounts made available to
6	them in this section, subject to the standards and criteria established in this
7	section.
8	Sec. 2. RECREATION SAFETY GRANTS; APPROPRIATION
9	The amount of \$5,000,000.00 is appropriated from the Coronavirus Relief
10	Fund to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development for grants to
11	Vermont ski area businesses to make necessary physical improvements to their
12	facilities in order to mitigate public health and safety risks to the public due to
13	the COVID-19 public health emergency.
14	Sec. 3. BUY LOCAL CONSUMER STIMULUS; MARKETING
15	(a) The amount of \$60,000,000.00 is appropriated from the Coronavirus
16	Relief Fund to the Department of Tourism and Marketing for the Restart
17	Vermont Marketing Program to encourage visitation, relocation, and consumer
18	spending in Vermont to support businesses that have suffered economic harm
19	due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.
20	(b) Eligible uses for the funds appropriated in this section include:

1	(1) \$50,000,000.00 for a statewide consumer stimulus program with
2	direct incentives to maximize the consumer spending power of Vermonters, to
3	support restaurants, retail stores, lodging establishments, tourism and cultural
4	attractions, and other businesses suffering economic harm due to continued
5	capacity and travel restrictions imposed in response to COVID-19.
6	(2) \$10,000,000.00 for marketing activities that promote:
7	(A) travel to and within Vermont to increase consumer spending at
8	tourism, hospitality, retail, and related businesses;
9	(B) purchase of locally made products to support Vermont producers;
10	<u>and</u>
11	(C) Vermont as an ideal place to relocate in the wake of the COVID-
12	19 pandemic to bring new residents and businesses to the State to provide
13	additional economic activity in Vermont communities to support businesses
14	impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency.
15	Sec. 4. 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 137, Sec. 1(a) is amended to read:
16	(a) The purpose of this act is to appropriate \$213,200,000.00 monies from
17	the Coronavirus Relief Fund to cover necessary broadband connectivity,
18	information technology, housing, and economic relief expenses incurred due
19	to, or as a result of, the COVID-19 public health emergency.
20	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE
21	This act shall take effect on passage.
