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RESTORATION OF SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION AID for CANAAN SCHOOL DISTRICT

- ← Canaan School District has a comprehensive school system for students PreK through grade 12 including a Career and Technical Education (CTE) Center. It has been designated as a geographically isolated location with no viable Vermont merger options serving 175 students from Canaan, neighboring NEK Choice communities Bloomfield, Brunswick, Lemington, Norton and tuition-based New Hampshire students.
- ♣ In November 2019, Vermont Secretary of Education, Daniel French and the New Hampshire Commissioner of Education, Frank Edelblut, officially declared the formation of an Interstate School Planning Committee with a goal for the State of New Hampshire and the State of Vermont to increase the educational opportunities for children within both states.
- ♣ The Interstate School Planning Committee has identified Canaan Memorial High School as the most strategic site for our interstate regional high school with 99% of the students living within a 20 mile radius and for the opportunity that they provide with their strong established dual enrollment college offerings and hands-on learning at their Career and Technical Education (CTE) Center.
- ➡ During building walk-throughs of all the potential interstate schools, it became apparent to the Committee that buildings in Vermont were in a lesser overall condition compared to the New Hampshire schools, which triggered the Committee to seek grant funding for a facilities study of Canaan Schools.
- ♣ To date, the Committee has obtained \$17,500 in funding from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation for the facilities study to understand how educational programs and amenities fit within existing facilities and to identify deficiencies using the Vermont and New Hampshire Planning and Design Guidelines as a benchmark.
- ♣ The findings of the facilities study estimated costs at \$4,000,000 to \$9,000,000 in renovations and efficiency improvements for upgrades related to ventilation, heating, electrical, windows, fire alarms, sprinklers, roof repairs and accessibility.
- ♣ In March 2020, a \$1,000,000 bond article will be presented to the Canaan Community with \$544,000 to address a number of ADA requirements, \$248,818 to address egress lighting and vintage wiring, \$184,400 to address roof and foundation repairs with \$22,782 for contingency; still not addressing the majority of deficiencies with the buildings established in 1946 (Memorial High School) and 1960 (Elementary School).
- ♣ The small rural community of Canaan has very little business tax base, a large number of fixed income residents and is located in the county with the highest poverty levels in the state. The restoration of school construction aid will help us to provide safe and healthy learning environments, equitable to other Vermont communities and our counterparts in New Hampshire.
- ♣ The Canaan School District understands the need for our students at Canaan Schools to be a piece of the Interstate puzzle in modeling the educational future at a more reasonable costs to our taxpayers. It is imperative that the support for school construction aid be restored for the students of our small rural school, to not miss out on the economic opportunity of collaboratively working together with the schools on the other side of the Connecticut River.

- Implementing Personalized Learning Plans that engage students in reflective thinking about their strengths, interests, goals, and needs
