8	§ 2945. <u>STATE</u> ADVISORY COUNCIL <u>PANEL</u> ON SPECIAL	
9	EDUCATION	
10	(a) There is created the <u>State</u> Advisory <u>Council</u> <u>Panel</u> on Special Education	
11	that shall consist of 19 members who are representative of the State population	
12	and involved with, or concerned with, the education of children with	
13	disabilities. All members of the Council Panel shall serve for a term of three	
14	years or until their successors are appointed and shall not serve more than two	
15	consecutive terms. Terms shall begin on April July 1 of the year of	
16	appointment. A majority of the members shall be either individuals with	
17	disabilities or parents of children with disabilities.	
18	(1) Seventeen of the members shall be appointed by the The Governor	
19	shall make the following appointments with the advice of the Secretary.	
20	Among the gubernatorial appointees shall be upon the recommendation of the	
21	indicated person or organization:	

1	(A) <u>a sufficient number of individuals with disabilities and parents of</u>			
2	children with disabilities (ages birth through 26 years of age) to ensure that a			
3	majority of the members of the Panel are individuals with disabilities and			
4	parents of children with disabilities, including:			
5	(i) not less than two individuals with disabilities, at least one of			
6	whom shall be a student when appointed; and			
7	(ii) not less than two parents of children with disabilities (ages			
8	birth through 26 years of age) upon the recommendation of the designated			
9	parent training and information organization, Vermont Developmental			
10	Disabilities Council, or representatives of the State protection and advocacy			
11	system;			
12	(B) one representative of the State protection and advocacy system;			
13	(C) two teachers upon the recommendation of the Vermont National			
14	Education Association;			
15	(B)(D) two representatives of State agencies involved in the			
16	financing or delivery of related services to children with disabilities;			
17	(C)(E) a <u>one</u> representative of independent schools <u>upon the</u>			
18	recommendation of the Vermont Independent Schools Association;			
19	(D)(F) at least one representative of a vocational, community, or			
20	business organization concerned with the provision of transition services to			
21	children with disabilities;			

1	(E) (G) a <u>one</u> representative from the State juvenile and adult			
2	corrections agency upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of			
3	Corrections;			
4	(F) individuals with disabilities;			
5	(G) parents of children with disabilities, provided the child shall be			
6	younger than 26 years old at the time his or her parent is appointed to the			
7	Counci l;			
8	(H) two State and local education officials, including officials who			
9	carry out activities under subtitle B of title VII of the McKinney-Vento			
10	Homeless Assistance Act;			
11	(I) a representative two representatives of higher education who			
12	prepares prepare special education and related services personnel upon the			
13	recommendation of the Vermont Higher Education Collaborative;			
14	(J) a <u>one</u> representative from the State child welfare department			
15	responsible for foster care; and			
16	(K) two special education administrators upon the recommendation			
17	of the Vermont Council of Special Education Administrators; and			
18	(L) two at large members.			
19	(2) In addition, two members of the General Assembly shall be			
20	appointed, one from the House of Representatives and one from the Senate.			
21	The Speaker shall appoint the House member and the Committee on			

1	Committees shall appoint the Senate member. Appointees may be appointed		
2	to fill more than one role except that:		
3	(A) individuals appointed to fill a role or roles pursuant to		
4	subdivision (A) or (B) of this subdivision (a)(1) shall not be appointed to fill		
5	any other role; and		
6	(B) individuals appointed to fill a role or roles pursuant to		
7	subdivisions (C)–(K) of this subdivision (a)(1) shall not be appointed to fill		
8	roles pursuant to subdivision (A) or (B) of this subdivision (a)(1).		
9	(b) The Council Panel shall elect its own chair from among its		
10	membership. The Council Panel shall meet annually at the call of the Chair,		
11	and other meetings may be called by the Chair at such times and places as he		
12	or she may determine to be necessary.		
13	(c) The members of the Council Panel who are employees of the State shall		
14	receive no additional compensation for their services, but actual and necessary		
15	expenses shall be allowed State employees, and shall be charged to their		
16	departments or institutions. The members of the Council Panel who are not		
17	employees of the State shall receive a per diem compensation as provided		
18	under 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for each day of official business and reimbursement		
19	for actual and necessary expenses at the rate allowed State employees.		
20	(d) The Council Panel shall:		

1	(1) assume all responsibilities required of the State advisory panel by			
2	federal law advise the Agency of Education and State Board of Education of			
3	the unmet needs within the State in the education of children with disabilities;			
4	(2) review periodically the rules, regulations, standards, and guidelines			
5	pertaining to special education and recommend to the State Board any changes			
6	it finds necessary comment publicly on any rules or regulations proposed by			
7	the State regarding the education of children with disabilities;			
8	(3) comment on any new or revised rules, regulations, standards, and			
9	guidelines proposed for issuance advise the Agency of Education and State			
10	Board of Education in developing evaluations and reporting data to the			
11	Secretary under 20 U.S.C. § 1418; and			
12	(4) advise the State Board in the development of any State plan for			
13	provision of special education Agency of Education and State Board of			
14	Education in developing corrective action plans to address findings identified			
15	in federal monitoring reports under 20 U.S.C. chapter 33, subchapter II; and			
16	(5) advise the Agency of Education and State Board of Education in			
17	developing and implementing policies relating to coordination of services for			
18	children with disabilities.
