15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
16	Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A. § 2 is added to read:
17	§ 2. ACCESS TO GENDER-SEGREGATED SCHOOL PROGRAMS,
18	ACTIVITIES, AND FACILITIES
19	(a) A student enrolled in a Vermont public or independent school shall be
20	permitted to participate in gender-segregated school programs and activities,

1	including athletic teams and competitions, and use facilities consistent with the
2	individual's gender identity, irrespective of the gender listed on the student's
3	records. As used in this section, "gender identity" means as an individual's
4	actual or perceived gender identity, or gender-related characteristics
5	intrinsically related to an individual's gender or gender identity, regardless of
6	the individual's assigned sex at birth.
7	(b) School teachers and other staff shall address students by the name and
8	pronoun corresponding to their gender identity. Except as required by law or
9	where necessary to ensure health and safety records are accurate, schools shall
10	use the name and gender preferred by the student on all official records.
11	Except as required by law or with a student's permission, school teachers and
12	other staff shall not disclose information that may reveal a student's
13	transgender or gender nonconforming status.
14	(c) Schools are encouraged to allow teachers, other staff, and students to
15	identify their sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression on any
16	forms used to collect that demographic data, as appropriate.
