Rashid - Rashid is 14-years-old. He was born in Uvira, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). The family fled the country because of political violence and settled in a refugee camp in Burundi. They waited 15 years to be resettled in the United States. The family was resettled to Vermont where "they immediately felt welcomed by the Winooski community." Rashidi is the fourth child of seven children. He is also the second eldest male in the household. Rashid is a hard working young man who has some challenges with verbal expression, but a passion for expressing himself through music.

Bonne-Idee - Bonne-Idee is 21-years-old. He was born in Uvira, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). The family fled the country because of political violence and settled in a refugee camp in Burundi. They waited 17 years to be resettled in the United States. The



family was initially placed in North Carolina. However, because of the lack of family and friend's support together with a resettlement program that was not meeting their needs, the family made the move to Vermont. Bonne Idee is the oldest male child in the family, as a result he shares similar family leadership responsibilities as his mother. Bonne-Idee is a quiet deeply spiritual young man who feels great gratitude to America for his family's resettlement. Bonne-Idee has found peace and healing from the stress in his life in his music.

From Mike Webster, WSD employee and sound engineer who recorded video *Twende Shuleni*:

"The Twende Shuleni musical composition was first created to give Bonne-Idee and Rashid a way of expressing themselves musically and in a manner that might provide them an opportunity for positive feedback— considering the numerous challenges refugees have to their self esteem together with the serious trauma they have suffered from the violence of ethnic conflicts in East Africa. Once the musical composition was recorded, they wanted to shoot a video. We coached them through the writing of a script, logistics and I shot the video at the school. This effort arguably was possible by coincidence — knowing me from school. However, it makes one wonder if the school district had the resources how many other Winooski students might be able to grow, productively channel teen energy/emotions, and give artistic value back to the community."
