Hello House Education Committee members,

Thank you again for letting me and GIV students testify about the Governor's Institutes to you last week!

I am writing to follow up on Rep. Hooper's question about what it would take to increase GIV's capacity to serve 5% of the VT high school population instead of the 2% we currently serve. The short answer is an annual appropriation of approximately **\$850,000** would help us grow our budget to \$2.2 million where we could support that number. (The current appropriation is \$192,654.) This amount would underwrite costs for students living in poverty and add stipends to permit more of the most disadvantaged students to enroll. It would take 5-7 years for GIV build the infrastructure to support 150% growth in capacity.

A more modest goal of a 12.5% enrollment increase to 676 students, which also triples health and medical education capacity and could be completed within two years, would necessitate a line item adjustment from \$192,654 to \$285,000.

Thank you for the opportunity to research and answer the question. Two other updates I'd like to share with you:

Yesterday <u>WVNY</u> and <u>WCAX</u> covered a GIV Winter Weekend where 75 high schoolers pursued topics like microcontrollers, leadership and journalism. <u>Watch the video here.</u>

Also, last Friday I spoke to Education Secretary French, and he said that if the legislature asks him, he will support increasing the line item for GIV as he thinks it is well worth expanding.
