6	(q)(1) Emergency waiver. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this
7	section, the Commission may waive, for a specified and limited time, the
8	prohibitions contained in this section upon site preparation for or construction
9	of a telecommunications facility necessary for maintaining or improving access
10	to telecommunications services during an emergency situation, pending full
11	review under this section.
12	(2) A person seeking a waiver under this subsection shall file a petition
13	with the Commission and shall provide copies to the Department of Public
14	Service and the Agency of Natural Resources. The Commission may require
15	that additional notice be provided to those listed in subsection (e) of this
16	section. Upon receipt of the petition, the Commission shall conduct an
17	expedited preliminary hearing.
18	(3) An order granting a waiver may include terms, conditions, and
19	safeguards to mitigate significant adverse impacts, including the posting of a
20	bond or other security, as the Commission deems proper, based on the scope
21	and duration of the requested waiver.

1	(4) A waiver shall be granted only when the Commission finds that:
2	(A) good cause exists due to an emergency situation;
3	(B) the waiver is necessary to maintain or provide access to wireless
4	telecommunications services;
5	(C) procedures will be followed to minimize significant adverse
6	impacts under the criteria specified in subdivision (c)(1) of this section; and
7	(D) taking into account any terms, conditions, and safeguards that the
8	Commission may require, the waiver will promote the general good of the
9	State.
10	(5) Upon the expiration of a waiver, if a certificate of public good has
11	not been issued under this section, the Commission shall require the removal,
12	relocation, or alteration of the facilities subject to the waiver, as it finds will
13	best promote the general good of the State.
