OPENING REMARKS:

Chairperson White -- Chairperson Stevens -- Members of the Committees -

Thank you for this opportunity to discuss my candidacy for the Adjutant and Inspector General of the Vermont National Guard.

I am Dave Baczewski.

I view this process as critically important -- to not only the men and women of the Vermont National Guard -- but to all Vermonters. We have a critical role to the State of Vermont with our Readiness for Emergencies and Disasters.

And we have **Missions of Serious Nature beyond the borders of Vermont** that take us around the world.

For Both, we must be properly **TRAINED AND READY** – to respond at a moment's notice. I fully **accept and I am prepared to lead** this effort.

In addition, the position of Adjutant General is to provide LEADERSHIP -- not only in mission readiness -- but TO COMMAND A CULTURE AND ETHIC THAT MEETS AND EXCEEDS ALL EXPECTATIONS OF A CHANGING SOCIETY.

My self-driven moral code will always be regulated by the principle of "doing what is right" with regards to ethics and fairness. I practice this with my family; my wife and my two daughters -- and I bring these principles into my professional career.

I believe the Guard must **Regain and then Maintain Public Trust**. I accept this obligation and **I** will remain accountable. **PUBLIC TRUST IS THE MORAL FOOTING OF ALL WE DO!**

My leadership style focuses on **PEOPLE**. I seek collaboration from outside Stakeholders to assist the Vermont National Guard -- help us focus on improving our culture – help us to be more inclusive, fair, and open. I seek guidance from organizations like the **Vermont Commission on Women**. We need their valuable insights.

My leadership style is that **ALL INDIVIDUALS** are treated **Fairly and Equally**. I demand accountability and have an **open-door policy** -- if a problem exists -- come to me directly – I will listen and **when action is required**, I will always act.

I have a true focus on being part of the greater Vermont community. Most - if not all Representatives and Senators - have guard members in their district — we need to work as a team (TAG, legislature, governor, communities) to find solutions to the challenges we

face. Solutions to problems that include recruiting, retention and cultural change. I need your help -- and I strongly endorse transparency in all we do.

CLOSING REMARKS:

If we truly want to change the culture of the Vermont National Guard -- we need strong Leadership.

I believe that I can provide this type of reliable and capable leadership.

I also believe that we need strong leadership from our Governor and strong leadership from our Legislature. Together, and only together, we can make a difference.

Together we can inspire others to have confidence in themselves and in us - Confidence that will provide the Impetus for progress.

Not a single person or body of people can accomplish this on their own. Leaders can only deliver results through other people, so if anything is going to change, we need to focus on the people - as a collective body - with the sincere motivation and drive to make those changes.

My pledge to you is that I will provide genuine, honest and straightforward leadership as Adjutant and Inspector General of the Vermont National Guard.

This is who I am as a person.
