Proposed Language Revisions to H.547, Montpelier's Charter Change

May 9, 2019

H. 547 Original Bill Language:

(D) Enact ordinances enforcing minimum energy efficiency standards and disclosure requirements, for existing and new commercial and residential properties, that are generally consistent with State, federal, and other energy efficiency standards and reporting systems.

Revised language after the 5/8/19 House Gov Ops hearing:

(D) Enact ordinances that regulate and enforce minimum energy efficiency standards and disclosure requirements for existing and new commercial and residential buildings. The energy efficiency standards will be no lower than those established by the State.

These changes would remove any rental energy standards requirements and focus only on energy efficiency information disclosure. With this charter change and ensuing ordinance, this approach would allow Montpelier to pave the way for Vermont communities to make energy visible, allow buyers to see the expected energy costs of the property they are buying or renting, and better value energy investments. Energy transparency will help real estate markets work more effectively while providing consumer protection.

If H.547 passes, Montpelier will embark on a robust and inclusive stakeholder process, that will include at least the following stakeholders:
