I also wanted to share in writing some of the principles that we believe are essential for effective civilian oversight of law enforcement. These are discussed in much further detail in the law review article that can be found here

Key components of an effective civilian review board

- Board majority nominated by civic organizations
 - o All non-law enforcement, supported by professional staff
 - Majority nominated by civic organizations
- Broad scope to review complaints
 - Board must be able to review a broad scope of complaints regarding misconduct
- Independent investigatory authority
 - The Board needs the ability to subpoena persons and documents
- Ability to ensure discipline sticks
 - o Decisions of the board must be binding, not just recommendations
- Ability to audit policies and practices
 - The board must have the ability to review underlying policies that might leads to rights violations
- Secure funding
 - Funding must be secure and robust
- Due process protections for police officers
 - Officers must be able to contest allegations and have representation throughout the entire process
- Public access and public reporting
 - The board must be easy to access for the public and publish regular reports. At the same time there needs to be protection against retaliation for members of the public who bring forward complaints.
