Hi HGO,

Attached please find a draft S.233 strike-all. I have attached it in two forms:

- 1) An annotated version, showing potential changes from the bill as passed Senate; and
- 2) A clean copy, implementing the changes shown in the annotated version.

The changes are in regard to the following professions based on the feedback from their professional regulatory entities: professional educators, electricians, and plumbers. Please refer to the annotated version to review these changes.

- 1) *Professional educators.* Pursuant to <u>AoE's written testimony</u> and in consultation with AoE General Counsel:
 - <u>Pg. 14, line 5</u>: Adds "licensed" preceding "practice" re: licensure based on three years' practice in another state, since some states may not require licensure to teach in private schools.
 - <u>Pg. 14, lines 9-10</u>: Clarifying language to distinguish this subdiv. (B)'s ability to be licensed based on three years' practice in another state from the separate, current law ability for a person to be licensed by reciprocity (shown in new Sec. 8).
 - <u>Pg. 16, lines 4-11</u>: Correcting the duties of the Sec. of AoE vs. the Standards Board to conform to current statutory authority.
 - <u>Pg. 17, new Sec. 8</u>: Related to pg. 14, lines 9-10, described above, clarifying that the current law ability to be licensed by reciprocity as set forth in this Sec. 8's current law 16 VSA 1696(b) is in addition to this bill's new ability to be licensed based on three years' practice in another state.
- 2) *Electricians.* Pursuant to DPS testimony and in consultation with the Director:
 - <u>Pg. 19, line 7 pg. 20, line 6</u>: Eliminating the criminal background pre-application determination, since criminal convictions are not a bar to electrician licensure.
 - Pg. 21, lines 6-7: Eliminating the fee for the criminal background pre-application determination.
- 3) *Plumbers*. Pursuant to DPS testimony and in consultation with the Director:
 - Pg. 35 and pg. 37, lines 4-7: Same changes as electricians.
