16	(a) When a dentist or dental therapist performs a dental procedure requiring
17	the administration of conscious sedation, deep sedation, or general anesthesia,

- 18 the sedation or anesthesia shall be administered and monitored at all times by a
- 19 <u>separate health care professional who shall be physically present before and</u>

1	during the procedure and while the patient is in recovery and who shall be one
2	of the following health care professionals:
3	(1) a dentist or dental therapist licensed under this chapter who holds the
4	appropriate sedation or anesthesia endorsement or specialty from the Board;
5	(2) an anesthesiologist licensed to practice medicine under chapter 23 or
6	33 of this title who has completed a residency in anesthesiology approved by
7	the American Board of Anesthesiology or the American Osteopathic Board of
8	Anesthesiology or their predecessors or successors; or
9	(3) a certified registered nurse anesthetist licensed under chapter 28 of
10	this title.
11	(b) A dentist may administer nondental anesthesia if he or she meets the
12	following requirements:

14	(b)(c) The Board shall refer a complaint or disciplinary proceeding about a
15	dentist arising from his or her the dentist's administration of nondental
16	anesthesiology to the Board of Medical Practice, which shall have jurisdiction
17	to investigate and sanction and limit or revoke the dentist's license to the same
18	extent that it may for physicians licensed under chapter 23 of this title.
