5	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to increase the
6	market rates used to make benefit determinations within the Child Care
7	Financial Assistance Program. It proposes to enable expenditures for the
8	modernization of the Bright Futures Information System. This bill also
9	proposes to appropriate funds for scholarships and student loan repayment
10	assistance for individuals employed by a regulated, privately operated center-
11	based child care program or family child care home. This bill proposes to
12	allow certain family child care providers to use their experience to meet the
13	Department for Children and Families' educational requirements.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

18	The General Assembly finds that:

2	Sec. 2. 33 V.S.A. § 3512 is amended to read:
3	§ 3512. CHILD CARE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM;
4	ELIGIBILITY
5	(a)(1) The Child Care Financial Assistance Program is established to
6	subsidize, to the extent that funds permit, the costs of child care for families
7	that need child care services in order to obtain employment, to retain
8	employment, or to obtain training leading to employment. Families seeking
9	employment shall not be entitled to participate in the Program for a period in
10	excess of one month up to three months, unless that period is extended by the
11	Commissioner.

13	(4) By September 30, 2021, a regulated center-based child care program
14	or family child care home as defined by the Department in rule shall not
15	receive funds pursuant to this subsection that are in excess of what the center-
16	based child care program or family child care home charges for tuition.

19	(a)(1) In fiscal year 2020, \$X is appropriated from the General Fund to the
20	Department for Children and Families' Child Development Division, which
21	shall use the funds to provide student loan repayments to any individual

1	employed by a privately operated center-based child care program or family
2	child care home that is regulated by the Division.
3	(2) An eligible individual shall:
4	(A) work in a privately operated center-based child care program or
5	family child care home that is regulated by the Division for at least an average
6	of 30 hours per week for 48 weeks of the year; and
7	(B) receive an annual salary of not more than \$40,000.00.
8	(3) Upon submission of an application to the Division, an individual
9	may receive up to \$2,000.00 annually in student loan repayment assistance for
10	work in a private preschool classroom and up to \$3,000.00 annually in student
11	loan repayments for work in an infant or toddler classroom.
12	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that an appropriation be made
13	in fiscal years 2021 through 2024 to accomplish the purpose set forth in
14	subsection (a) of this section.
15	(c)(1) The Division shall adopt policies, procedures, and guidelines
16	necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
17	(2) Funds used from this appropriation shall be expended for repayment
18	of student loans. Student loan repayments shall be available pursuant to this
19	section on a first-come, first-served basis until the appropriation is depleted.

1	(d) Otherwise eligible individuals with access to alternative loan
2	forgiveness or loan repayment programs shall not be considered eligible for
3	repayment assistance under this section.

6	(a) In fiscal year 2020, \$X is appropriated from the General Fund to the
7	Vermont Association for the Education of Young Children (VTAEYC) for the
8	purpose of expanding eligible recipients to include any individual employed by
9	a privately operated center-based child care program or family child care home
10	that is regulated by the Department for Children and Families' Child
11	Development Division.
12	(b) VTAEYC shall adopt policies, procedures, and guidelines necessary to
13	implement the provisions of this section. Scholarships distributed pursuant to
14	this section shall be available on a first-come, first-served basis until any
15	designated funds are depleted.
16	(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that appropriations be made in
17	fiscal years 2021 through 2024 to accomplish the purpose set forth in
18	subsection (a) of this section.

1	Sec. 7. REPORT; T.E.A.C.H. AND STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT
2	ASSISTANCE EVALUATION
3	On or before January 1, 2024, Commissioner for Children and Families, in
4	consultation with stakeholders, shall submit a report to the House Committee
5	on Human Services and to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare:
6	(1) evaluating the effectiveness of the student loan repayment program

13	Financial Assistance Program funding amount in fiscal year 2020. The Early
14	Care and Development Program shall cease operation on June 30, 2019.
