

## **House Bill 581**

## **Legislative Review of Wildlife Funding**

## Why the legislature needs to review funding?

- Department of Fish & Wildlife (DFW) revenue from sale of hunting, trapping and fishing licenses is expected to continue to decline over time
- General Fund (tax money) allocation to make up the difference has increased 400% (1990-2019)
- Both the General Fund and federal wildlife funding are unstable funding sources for DFW
- Both the Association of F & W Agencies and the Vermont DFW have called it a crisis.
- DFW faces the need for stable and increasing funding because:
- · Agency responsibilities have grown exponentially over time and will continue to
- More attention must be given to the steadily increasing number of species that are endangered and threatened non-game
- Increased research, monitoring and interventions will be required because of challenges such as climate change, habitat loss, invasive species, pollution

## 581 would address the funding issue

The bill would create a working group of legislators to advise the general assembly regarding the status of wildlife funding

- A. The working group will assess:
  - a. Changing standards resulting from evolving ecological science and values
  - b. Changing environmental trends
  - c. Shifting demographic and cultural changes and their impact on funding
  - d. Stability of all income streams
  - e. Changes to Dept responsibilities and to public expectations
  - f. Current allocation and adequacy of resources and increasing need for scientific reporting and permitting
  - g. Estimated revenues and other resources need for new and needed programming
  - h. Appropriateness of current allocation of DFW resources by customer segment, service types and fee amount
- B. The group will recommend how DFW can obtain adequate funding for the next 15 years by considering:
  - a. Projected agency costs in light of the above assessment
  - b. New, diversified, stable and adequate funding sources to complement, replace and/or expand existing DFW revenues in order to meet expected costs
