It takes a strong alliance of dedicated entities to address all the issues associated with Lake Champlain's impaired water quality. Each agency or entity involved in the partnership offers unique and effective resources, funding mechanisms, technical experts, and outreach techniques. They each bring something valuable to the table. No one agency is going to fix this problem. Through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), each partner contributes skills, knowledge, and services that help private landowners in Vermont achieve measurable water quality and wildlife habitat improvements in the most efficient, cost-effective way.

The Goal

The VT Agricultural Water Quality Partnership (VAWQP) seeks to accelerate improved water quality by collaborating to provide outreach, education, and technical and financial assistance directly to agricultural producers with respect for each partner's vision, role and capacity.

The leadership of the VAWQP meets quarterly to coordinate goals, report on progress, and facilitate and enhance conservation work throughout the state.

All the employees of the partnership meet annually to enhance communication and coordinate strategy.
