Multiple Pathways To Enhance the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Workforce

Master's Level: Increase the number of licensed Mental Health Counselors with a focus on addictions and Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselors

Baccalaureate Level: Increase the number of certified Alcohol and Drug Counselors by creating a new educational pathway that will outlive the life cycle of the grant

Associates Level: Increase the number of certified Apprentice Addictions Professionals







Tuition Scholarships for Mental Health Counseling Graduate Programs

Objective: Expand the number of licensed mental health counselors

Our Graduate Counseling Programs:

- 1. NVU-Johnson: MA with a concentration addictions
 - 60-credit program requiring 600 hours of internship face-to-face evening/weekends
- 2. Program in Clinical Mental Health MS with a concentration in addictions
 - Recently acquired from SNHU
 - 63/66-credit program requiring 600 or 900 hours of internship face-to-face weekend intensive
 - Offered in VT, NH, ME, WI, and AK
 - Funding will allow us to build a more flexible delivery model that will outlive grant termination





Tuition Scholarships for Mental Health Counseling Graduate Programs

Proposed tuition support for new students:

- ✓ Tuition scholarships for 45 students in both programs (cohorts starting fall 2019 and 2020)
 - Discount = 54.5% (equivalent to CCV tuition rate per credit) for entire program

Proposed tuition support for current students:

- ✓ Tuition scholarships for 15 students (MS) and 20 students (MA)
 - Discount = 22% for two years

Residency requirement upon graduation





Alcohol and Drug Counseling (ADC) Pathway

Objective: Create a pathway for Alcohol and Drug Counselor Certification

- √ Work with Office of Professional Regulation (OPR) to create the 270 hours of required course work
- ✓ Available to students in bachelor's programs (e.g., Applied Psychology and Human Services) and Master's students seeking licensure (LADC)
- √ Tuition-free access for three cohorts of 20 students (20 students per year)
- **✓** Courses will be offered beyond termination of grant
- √ The ADC pathway does not presently exist in the state of Vermont





Apprentice Addictions Professional (AAP)

Objective: Increase the number of certified AAPs

- **✓** Offer CCV course "Addiction, an Introduction to Clinical Studies" tuition free
- **✓** Offer CU course "Substance Use and Addictions" tuition free

Creating and offering ADC coursework:	\$610kvisiting faculty memberinstructional designer
Offering AAP courses:	\$70k
Administrative:	 \$174k (8.8% of total) Advising Internship placement Marketing Curriculum alignment
Total:	\$1.98m
