4	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to provide
5	additional CARES Act relief to Vermont businesses that have suffered
6	economic harm due to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

8	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
9	Sec. 1. 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 137, Sec. 6 is amended to read:
10	Sec. 6. COVID-19; ECONOMIC SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES
11	AND INDIVIDUALS
12	(a) Appropriations; grants. The following amounts are appropriated from
13	the Coronavirus Relief Fund to the named recipients to provide grants to
14	businesses that have suffered economic harm due to the COVID-19 public
15	health emergency and economic crisis.
16	(1) \$82,000,000.00 for additional emergency economic recovery grants
17	pursuant to 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350), Secs. 2-3
18	\$175,000,000.00 for grants to businesses that meet the eligibility criteria in
19	subsection (c) of this section as follows:

1	(A) $$56,000,000.00$ $$144,000,000.00$ to the Agency of Commerce
2	and Community Development.
3	(B) \$26,000,000.00 to the Department of Taxes.

5	(5) \$5,000,000.00 to the Agency of Commerce and Community
6	Development to grant to the Vermont Arts Council for grants to nonprofit arts
7	and cultural organizations. For purposes of calculating reduction in revenue
8	under this subdivision, "revenue" does not include tax deductible charitable
9	contributions.

11	(c) Eligibility; grant amount; terms; guidelines.
12	(1) To be eligible for a grant under subsection (a) or (b) of this section, a
13	business must meet the following eligibility criteria and comply with the
14	guidelines adopted pursuant to 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350) unless
15	otherwise provided in this section, except that a business must demonstrate that
16	it suffered a 50 percent or greater reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19
17	public health emergency and economic crisis in a monthly or quarterly period
18	from March 1, 2020 to September 1, 2020 as compared to the same period in
19	2019 subdivision (4) of this subsection:
20	(A) The business is a private, for-profit or nonprofit organization that
21	is domiciled or has its primary place of business in Vermont.

1	(B) The business is either open at the time of application or is closed
2	due to the COVID-19 public health emergency but has a good-faith plan for
3	reopening.
4	(C) The business demonstrates need based on economic loss due to
5	the COVID-19 public health emergency from March 1, 2020 to December 1,
6	<u>2020.</u>
7	(2)(A) The Agency shall establish standards for determining the amount
8	of grant awards, provided that a business may not receive more than
9	\$300,000.00 in grant awards pursuant to 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 and
10	this act.
11	(B) Notwithstanding subdivision (2)(A) of this subsection, upon the
12	Agency's request and demonstration of need, the Joint Fiscal Committee may
13	approve additional grant funding to a business in excess of the maximum grant
14	amount.
15	(3) The Agency shall consider whether and by how much grant awards
16	should be adjusted based on whether an applicant has received financial
17	assistance from other sources.
18	(4) The Agency shall adopt and publish guidelines governing the
19	implementation of this section and may coordinate with local, regional, and
20	State economic development partners to administer grants pursuant to this
21	section.

2	(e) Prohibition on multiple sources of funding.
3	(1) A business may not receive a grant of Coronavirus Relief Fund
4	monies from more than one source, except that a business in the dairy sector
5	may apply for a grant under subdivision (a)(2)(B) of this section, provided that
6	the award is not for the same purpose covered under other assistance from the
7	Fund.
8	* * *
9	(g) Emergency economic recovery grant funds; transfer. If any funds
10	appropriated to Agency of Commerce and Community Development and the
11	Department of Taxes in 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 115 (S.350) remain both
12	unencumbered and unspent as of August 1, 2020, the Agency and Department
13	shall combine and administer those funds with the amounts made available to
14	them in this section, subject to the standards and criteria established in this
15	section.
16	Sec. 2. 2020 Acts and Resolves No. 137, Sec. 1(a) is amended to read:
17	(a) The purpose of this act is to appropriate \$213,200,000.00 monies from
18	the Coronavirus Relief Fund to cover necessary broadband connectivity,
19	information technology, housing, and economic relief expenses incurred due
20	to, or as a result of, the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Sec. 3. RECREATION SAFETY GRANTS; APPROPRIATION

1	The amount of \$5,000,000.00 is appropriated from the Coronavirus Relief
2	Fund to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development for grants to
3	Vermont ski area businesses to make necessary physical improvements to their
4	facilities in order to mitigate public health and safety risks to the public due to
5	the COVID-19 public health emergency.
6	Sec. 4. RESTART VERMONT MARKETING PROGRAM
7	The amount of \$4,000,000.00 is appropriated from the Coronavirus Relief
8	Fund to the Department of Tourism and Marketing for the Restart Vermont
9	Marketing Program to publicize the resumption of activities and steps taken to
10	ensure a safe experience.
11	Sec. 5. WORKFORCE TRAINING
12	(a) Appropriation. The amount of \$3,000,000.00 is appropriated
13	from the Coronavirus Relief Fund to the Vermont State Colleges, to
14	be divided between the Community College of Vermont and the
15	Vermont Technical Center based on enrollment, to serve Vermonters
16	who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic through layoffs.
17	furloughs, reduced hours, or due to being employed in an industry that
18	has been severely affected.
19	(b) CCV and VTC shall use the funds awarded pursuant to this
20	section to:

1	(1) offer courses and workshops to upskill affected Vermonters
2	in their current industry or reskill Vermonters who desire a change in
3	their career path for more economic stability, which may include
4	training for Vermonters to transition to the childcare sector and
5	business technical assistance for small businesses; and
6	(2) to provide for necessary school supplies, wrap-around
7	services, marketing of the program, and support staff.
8	Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE
9	This act shall take effect on passage.
