Step Up to Childcare – Application Packet

Dear Step Up to Childcare Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in our program.

We are excited to help eligible candidates begin working towards their Level One certification in the childcare profession.

Our program is approximately 60 hours of classroom time, which includes general orientation, CPR/First Aid, Vermont Childcare Orientation (on-line), and Fundamentals for Early Childhood Professionals (45-hour class at CCV). We also have included a 160 hour paid internship at one of our partnering local childcare centers.

This means that instead of paying to get your career started, you will be paid \$1700!

This opportunity is made possible by a Workforce Education and Training Fund grant thought the Vermont Department of Labor.

- Will be 18 years of age by May 10
- Background check and fingerprinting Orleans Country Sheriff (cost paid for by grant)

- TABE Scores please contact Northeast Kingdom Learning Services on Main Street in Newport to schedule a time to take a math and reading assessment

Admission

- Bring completed registration forms to North Country Career Center Adult Education office.
- We will call you for an interview and schedule your background check and fingerprinting appointment at Orleans County Sheriff Department.

Progression

- Accepted students must commit to strong attendance for orientation. Any time missed during orientation must be made up. The Fundamentals for Early Childhood Professionals training will also have an attendance policy.
- Students must pass CPR/First Aid, complete Vermont Childcare Orientation online, and prepare a resume before being recommended for an internship.
- Paid internships will begin once students are in the fourth week of "Fundamentals for Early Childhood Professionals" class at Community College of Vermont.

Completion

- "Fundamentals for Early Childhood Professionals" will end on September 23
- As the course ends, students will meet with Let's Grow Kids to discuss what their next steps are for furthering their professional certifications.
