


Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Terisa Thomas Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation House Corrections & Institutions Committee January 28, 2020





- Both programs create an Intended Use Plan (IUP) that shows which projects will be funded and programmatic changes
- Both SRFs are soliciting applications for the IUP now until February 24th.



DWSRF

- Low interest loans for almost any drinking water related planning, design, or construction
- Available funds of ~\$50M
- Available for municipalities and private entities
- Loan Forgiveness available
- 2019 creation of "hardship municipality"



CWSRF

- Low interest loans for wastewater, stormwater, CSOs
- Nonpoint sources projects (since 2018) for projects such as dam removals, agriculture water quality, wetland restoration, and conservation easements with a water quality benefit
- Available for municipalities and private entities
- Approximately \$100M in available funds



Pollution Control Grants

- Eligibility % based on affordability, public health need, water quality, resiliency and sustainability, and designated center
- Grants are appropriated by the legislature
- Grants not required to be
 accompanied by CWSRF loan
