4 Sec. 12a. CORRECTIONS; WORKFORCE TRAINING

5 (a)(1) On or before October 10, 2019, the Department of Corrections and
6 the Department of Labor shall execute a memorandum of understanding
7 governing the creation of a standardized program of education and training for
8 all new and existing probation and parole officers that includes components
9 related to:

10 (A) case plan implementation, including monitoring and facilitating
11 compliance with case plan goals;

12 (B) the significance of maintaining employment to offenders’
13 resilience against reoffending, and strategies to minimize barriers for offenders
14 to obtaining and maintaining employment; and

15 (C) minimizing the impact of program and supervision requirements
16 on the offender’s employment.

17 (2) The Departments shall provide written notice when the
18 memorandum of understanding is executed to the chairs of the House
19 Committees on Commerce and Economic Development and on Corrections
20 and Institutions and to the Senate Committees on Economic Development,
21 Housing and General Affairs and on Institutions.

1 (3) The Departments shall ensure that all incumbent probation and
2 parole officers receive the education and training under the program on or
3 before July 1, 2020.

4 (b) The Department of Corrections shall collaborate with the Department of
5 Motor Vehicles and other partners as necessary to ensure that an inmate is
6 provided with at least one form of government-issued identification, not to
7 include an inmate identification card, upon release from incarceration.

8 (c) On or before December 15, 2020, the Departments of Corrections and
9 Labor shall report to the House Committees on Commerce and Economic
10 Development and on Corrections and Institutions and to the Senate
11 Committees on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs and on
12 Institutions concerning the implementation of this section.
