  reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the bill be
  amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
  thereof the following:

- 9 § 4753. REVOLVING LOAN FUNDS; AUTHORITY TO SPEND; REPORT
  - (a) There is hereby established a series of special funds to be known as:
  - (1) The Vermont Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Pollution Control Revolving Fund, which shall be used, consistent with federal law, to provide loans for planning and construction of clean water projects, including acquisitions of project-related easements, land, options to purchase land, and temporary or permanent rights-of-way, and for implementing related management programs.

(b)(1) Each of such funds shall be established and held separate and apart from any other funds or monies of the State and shall be used and administered exclusively for the purpose of this chapter with the exception of transferring funds from the Vermont Drinking Water Planning Loan Fund and the Vermont

1	Drinking Water Source Protection Fund to the Vermont Environmental	
2	Protection Agency (EPA) Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, and from the	
3	Vermont Pollution Control Revolving Fund to the Vermont Environmental	
4	Protection Agency (EPA) Pollution Control Revolving Fund, when authorized	
5	by the Secretary.	
6	(2) These funds shall be administered by the Bond Bank on behalf of the

4	(4) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, municipal legislative
