5	(a) Appropriation. The sum of up to \$100,000.00 is appropriated from the
6	Coronavirus Relief Fund to the Sergeant at Arms in fiscal year 2021 for a
7	short-term and long-term space and health and safety needs assessment for the
8	Legislative Branch for COVID-19 mitigation and to meet social distancing
9	requirements.
10	(b) Purpose. The General Assembly determines that the expenditure of
11	monies from the Coronavirus Relief Fund as set forth in this section is
12	necessary for addressing the health and safety of legislators, staff, and the
13	public in the State House and other legislative space for the purpose of
14	COVID-19 mitigation.
15	(c) Authorization. On or before July 10, 2020, the Sergeant at Arms, in
16	consultation with the Department of Buildings and General Services, shall
17	contract with an independent third party for a short-term and long-term space
18	and health and safety needs assessment for the Legislative Branch for COVID-
19	19 mitigation. The assessment shall include:
20	(1) recommendations for health and safety infrastructure measures
21	needed to protect staff, legislators, and the public, mitigate COVID-19, and
22	meet social distancing requirements in the State House, and any other
23	Legislative Branch space;

2	additional space in the Capitol Complex for legislators, committee meetings,
3	and legislative staff offices, including 133 State Street; and
4	(3) short and long-term options for use of space for legislators,
5	committee meetings, and legislative staff offices Statewide.
6	(d) Report. On or before August 19, 2020, the Sergeant at Arms shall
7	submit the assessment described in subsection (a) of this section to the House
8	Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committee on
9	Institutions. The assessment shall include cost estimates for the
10	recommendations and options described in subdivisions $(a)(1)$ - (3) .

(e) Contracting procedures. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the

contrary, the Sergeant at Arms may enter into a contract with an independent

third party for the assessment described in this section without the need to

competitively bid such contracts. For the purposes of the assessment, the

public health risk posed by COVID-19 shall be deemed to be an emergency

situation that justifies the execution of sole source contracts pursuant to

Bulletin 3.5, the State's Procurement and Contracting Procedures.

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
