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Correctional Context

United States	5% of the world's population
	25% of the world's prison population
	350,000 penal population (1970)
	2,200,000 penal population (2014)
Vermont Department of Corrections annual budget	~\$155,000,000
Vermont spending per person in prison	~\$60,000
Vermont spending per K-12 student	~\$14,000
National Recidivism Rate	~60% (Corrections failure rate)
Vermont Recidivism Rate	~45% (Corrections failure rate)

Can we do better?

Impact of Higher Education on Recidivism

National Recidivism Rate: 60% Vermont Recidivism Rate: 45%

24%

Recidivism rate with a high school diploma

10%

Recidivism rate with 2 years of college

5%

Recidivism rate with 4 years of college

Cost Effectiveness of College in Prison

- ✓ \$1 spent = \$5 cost savings
- ✓ Direct cost of incarceration is greater than educational costs
- Break even point: reincarceration rate reduction between
 - 1.9% 2.6%
- ✓ Higher wages upon release
- ✓ Reduced correctional spending




What is the Liberal Arts in Prison Program?
