2	Fourth: In Sec. 3, Literacy Grant Program, by striking out subdivision
3	(b)(1) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
4	(1) The Literacy Grant Program is created to enable supervisory unions
5	to adopt best practices in teaching literacy instruction to students in
6	prekindergarten through grade 3.
7	(A) In recognition that literacy proficiency is a foundational learning
8	skill, this program is designed to assist supervisory unions implement 2018
9	Acts and Resolves No. 173 by providing students with the literacy skills
10	necessary to ensure that core instruction meets most needs of most students
11	and that students who struggle receive all instruction from highly skilled
12	teachers.
13	(B) Supervisory unions are encouraged to work together in a
14	sustained and targeted manner to improve literacy outcomes by applying
15	together for the grant funding or otherwise working collaboratively in a
16	manner that uses resources in an effective and efficient manner.
17	(C) Subject to the terms of the Program, grants shall be awarded to
18	eligible applicants for two consecutive years.
