2	In addition to meeting all the applicable early childhood program licensing
3	regulations of the Department for Children and Families, staff in prequalified
4	public and private prekindergarten education programs shall meet the
5	following qualifications:
6	(1) Teachers in each prekindergarten classroom in a district-operated
7	prekindergarten education programs shall hold a valid Vermont educator
8	license with an endorsement in either early childhood education or early
9	childhood special education;
10	(2) private prequalified prekindergarten education program operated in a
11	licensed Center Based Program shall employ, or contract for the services of, at
12	least one teacher who holds a valid Vermont educator license with an
13	endorsement in either early childhood education or early childhood special
14	education. Ten hours that the licensed teacher is present shall coincide with the
15	hours of prekindergarten education paid for by tuition from districts;
16	(3) The operator of each registered or licensed Family Child Care Home
