
Prekindergarten Education Defined

What defines Vermont's Universal Prekindergarten Education (UPK) is the implementation of high-quality, effective instruction by licensed educators who use evidence-based practices within intentionally designed early learning environments.

Early educators align curriculum with the Vermont Early Learning Standards while adapting experiences to support the full participation of each and every child to realize their full potential and promote successful outcomes.

Universal Prekindergarten Education (UPK)

Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A § 829 Prekindergarten Education Law Act 166 mandates that a state UPK monitoring system be established and implemented to ensure prequalified PreK programs are in compliance with the law.





UPK ACIS

Who must comply with the UPK ACIS?

UPK ACIS

- 1) Is based on current evidence focused on the elements of quality monitoring systems
- 2) Builds and aligns with AOE and AHS existing quality monitoring systems and processes
- 3) Addresses eleven compliance requirements of Act 166 as well as needs and priorities (VELS, portability, regions, etc.)
- 4) Is feasible to implement within Vermont's current resources and capabilities

UPK ACIS

- Q Ensures compliance with UPK requirements
- *** Promotes high quality PreK Education for each child
- Promotes equitable access to high quality PreK Education
- Q Focuses on continuous improvement
- Promotes balanced approach—professional development, training, technical assistance



Act 166 Compliance Requirements





- 1. Maintain good regulatory standing with Child Development Division (CDD) Childcare Licensing Regulations
- 2. Obtain and maintain 4 or 5 STep Ahead Recognition System (STARS) or National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) accreditation
- 3. Adhere to all applicable federal and state laws





- 4. Provide high quality PreK education for each child enrolled for a minimum of 10 hours per week for 35 weeks
- 5. Ensure program has AOE licensed early childhood educator or early childhood special educator present during PreK hours
- 6. Ensure curriculum alignment with Vermont Early Learning Standards (VELS)





- 7. Complete TSGOLD assessment and checkpoints for each child enrolled at least twice per school calendar year by December 15 and June 15
- 8. At least two times per school calendar year, provide parent/teacher conferences and child progress reports provide parent engagement opportunities





- 9. Permit onsite visits from AOE and Child Development Division
- 10. Permit onsite visits from partner school district staff
- 11. Participate and comply with all requirements of UPK Monitoring System

AOE/AHS Accountability & Continuous Improvement System (ACIS)

Key Components of UPK ACIS

1. UPK Application Process

- a) AHS verification (BFIS/STARS/fingerprint)
- b) AOE verification (VELS/Educator/Assurances)
- c) AOE Final Approval

2. Annual Assurance Data Collection

- 3. Monthly Act 166 Interagency Team Meetings
 - a) Establishing UPK ACIS interagency advisory committee
- 4. Training and technical assistance developed including learning modules, guidance documents and memos for clarification
- **5. Violation Thresholds**, Monitoring Approach, Violations, Correction Periods and Resolution for each Act 166 Requirement have been established
- **6. Procedures and Checklist** which designates roles and responsibilities across agencies.
- **7. Standardized notifications,** checklists, template documents, flow charts developed for each tier of ACIS framework

UPK ACIS Actions to Date

The AOE and AHS have conducted investigations of public and private PreK programs and have implemented corrective action plans, and on-site monitoring visits. As a result:

• 5 PreK programs have received a revocation notification for non-compliance of Act 166 requirements within the past 6 months.

Within the last 2 months:

- 11 PreK programs have been elevated to the Tier 2"needs assistance" or Tier 3 "needs intervention" and are receiving technical assistance currently
- 5 PreK programs have been reported to AOE and/or AHS for alleged concerns or violations. If a violation of childcare licensing regulations has been reported, AHS/CDD will conduct an investigation following agency procedures. If the violation is substantiated AOE receives notification and UPK ACIS investigation is initiated.
