


George Dewey- Growing up...

Attended Norwich University 2 years – Graduated from the Naval Academy in 1857 and Warranted a Shipman






In 1896 Advanced to the Rank Of Commodore

The Spanish Fleet was destroyed without a single loss of American Life



March 12,1899- U.S. Navy awarded George Dewey to the Rank- Admiral of the Navy



October 12, 1899- " Dewey Day"

Admiral George Dewey was welcomed home to Montpelier Vermont. A crowd close to 40,000 had gathered in the streets and at the Statehouse to celebrate this national hero and to welcome home their native son.



Admiral Dewey went into Manila bay, He had in him the raw material able to do so and the most material so he could meet the demands made upon him.




