

Vermont Retail Licenses

First-Class License:

- Permits the licensee to sell beer and wine to the public for consumption only on the premises for which the license is granted.
- Granted by the local control commissioners with approval of Board of Liquor and Lottery.

Second-Class License:

- Permits the licensee to export beer or wine and to sell beer or wine to the public for consumption off the premises for which the license is granted.
- May obtain a fortified wine permit to sell fortified wine for consumption off the premises for which the license is granted.
- May obtain a retail delivery permit to deliver alcoholic beverages to physical addresses in Vermont.
- Granted by the local control commissioners with the approval of the Board of Liquor and Lottery.

Third-Class License:

- Permits the licensee to sell spirits and fortified wines for consumption only on the premises for which the license is granted.
- Granted by the Board of Liquor and Lottery.

Fourth-Class License

- Permits a licensed manufacturer or rectifier to sell beverages manufactured by the licensee in unopened containers.
- Permits a licensed manufacturer or rectifier to distribute beverages manufactured by the licensee by the glass, with or without charge.
- Issued for tasting rooms or farmers market locations.
- Granted by the Board of Liquor and Lottery.
