2	The Committee on Government Operations to which was referred House
3	Bill No. 508 entitled "An act relating to approval of amendments to the charter
4	of the Town of Bennington" respectfully reports that it has considered the
5	same and recommends that the bill be amended by striking out all after the
6	enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 24 App. V.S.A. chapter 103 is amended to read:
8	CHAPTER 103. TOWN OF BENNINGTON
9	Preamble
10	The people of Bennington reaffirm faith in Government of the people, by
11	the people, and for the people and describe this government in a charter with
12	provision to review and amend. The charter of the Town of Bennington
13	reflects concern to improve the quality of life for all people and to improve the
14	operation of Town government.

16	§ 101. GENERAL LAW APPLIES
17	(a) All provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State relating to
18	towns and villages shall apply to the Town of Bennington, except as modified
19	by this charter;.
20	(b) The Town of Bennington shall have all the powers and functions
21	conferred upon towns and villages by the Constitution and general laws of this

1	the State and shall also have all implied powers necessary to implement such
2	powers and functions;.
3	(c) The powers and functions conferred upon the Town of Bennington by
4	this charter shall be in addition to the powers and functions conferred upon the
5	Town by the laws now in force or hereafter enacted of the State. Nothing in
6	this charter shall be construed as a limitation upon such powers and functions.
7	* * *
8	§ 203. COMPENSATION
9	(a) Compensation paid to the Select Board members shall be set by the
10	voters at Town meeting.
11	(b) Subject to subsection (a) of this section, the Select Board members shall
12	fix the compensation to of all elective officers and of all officers appointed by
13	the Select Board.
14	(c) The Town Manager, under policies approved by the Select Board
15	members, shall fix the compensation of all other officers and employees whose
16	compensation is not fixed by the Select Board pursuant to subsection (b) of this
17	section.
18	* * *

1	§ 301. SELECT BOARD MEMBERS,; THE LEGISLATIVE BODY
2	The Select Board shall constitute the legislative body of the Town of
3	Bennington and shall have all powers and authority necessary for the
4	performance of the legislative function.
5	* * *
6	§ 303. FURTHER POWERS OF SELECT BOARD MEMBERS
7	In addition to powers otherwise conferred by law, the Select Board
8	members shall also have the power to:
9	(1) organize, and from time to time reorganize, the Fire Department
10	under the supervision of a coordinating committee formed by the Select Board
11	from its members; such Department shall be a volunteer department and the,
12	unless an affirmative vote of the members of the Fire Department authorizes a
13	transition to a paid or combination paid and volunteer department as set forth
14	in a transition plan proposed by the Select Board working with a committee
15	formed from members of the Fire Department;
16	(2) Select Board shall have authority to continue any existing contract
17	with a volunteer fire department or to enter on behalf of the Town into
18	contracts with other volunteer fire departments to provide additional fire
19	protection to the inhabitants;

1	(2)(3) create departments not now existing, consolidate, or dissolve
2	departments as necessary or relevant for the performance of municipal
3	services;
4	(3)(4) create, consolidate, or dissolve commissions and committees not
5	now existing as necessary or relevant and appoint the members thereof;
6	(4)(5) provide for and shall provide on an annual basis an independent
7	audit of all Town financial records by a certified public accountant;
8	(5)(6) inquire into the conduct of any officer, commission, or
9	department and investigate any and all municipal affairs;
10	(6)(7) discharge all duties heretofore devolving on the Town Agent by
11	general law and hire attorneys on behalf of the Town; and
12	(7)(8) establish an adequate number of polling places within the Town
13	as required for the convenience of the Town voters and without regard to
14	election district boundaries, to the end that election expenses may be lessened
15	and confusion among the voters as to the proper place for them to vote may be
16	avoided; however, one such polling place shall be in North Bennington and the
17	central polling place shall be within the boundaries of the former Village of
18	Bennington.

1	§ 402. <u>TOWN</u> MANAGER NONPARTISAN
2	(a) The <u>Town</u> Manager shall be chosen solely on the basis of his/her his or
3	her executive, administrative, and professional qualifications.
4	(b) The <u>Town</u> Manager shall not take part in the organization or direction
5	of a political party, serve as a member of a party committee, nor be a candidate
6	for election to any public office.
7	§ 403. OATH AND BOND
8	Before entering upon his or her duties, the Town Manager shall be sworn to
9	the faithful performance of his or her duties by the Town Clerk and shall give a
10	bond to the Town be bonded in such amount and with such sureties as the
11	Select Board members may require.
12	§ 404. DUTIES FOR MANAGER
13	(a) The <u>Town</u> Manager shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Town
14	and shall <u>:</u>
15	(1) carry Carry out the policies established by the Select Board, to
16	whom the Town Manager shall be responsible accountable.
17	(b)(2) The Manager shall attend Attend all meetings of the Select Board,
18	except when his or her compensation or removal is being considered, shall
19	keep the Select Board members informed of the financial condition and future
20	needs of the Town, and shall make such other reports as may be required by

1	law, requested by the Select Board members, or deemed by him or her to be
2	advisable.
3	(c)(3) He or she shall perform Perform all other duties prescribed by this
4	charter, or required by law, or by resolution of the Select Board members.
5	(d)(4) The Manager shall be <u>Be</u> an ex-officio member of all standing
6	committees except the Zoning Development Review Board, but may and shall
7	not vote.
8	(e)(5) The Manager shall prepare Prepare an annual budget, submit it to the
9	Select Board members, and be responsible for its administration after adoption.
10	(f)(6) The Manager shall compile Compile for general distribution at the
11	end of each fiscal year a complete report on the finances and administrative
12	activities of the Town for the year.
13	(g)(7) The Manager shall provide Provide to the Select Board a monthly
14	financial statement, with a copy to the Town Treasurer.
15	(h)(8) The Manager shall perform Perform all duties now conferred by law
16	on the Road Commissioner within all areas of the Town, except within such
17	villages as may vote not to surrender their charters under this charter,
18	notwithstanding the provisions of 24 V.S.A. § 1236(5).
19	(i)(9) The Manager shall perform Perform all duties now conferred by law
20	on the Collector of Delinquent Taxes.

1	(j)(10) The Manager, under Under policies approved by the Select Board
2	members, shall, be the General Purchasing Agent of the Town and purchase all
3	equipment and supplies and contract for services for every department
4	pursuant to the purchasing and bid policies approved by the Select Board.
5	$\frac{(k)(11)}{(k)}$ The Manager shall be <u>Be</u> responsible for the system of accounts.
6	(1)(12) The Manager shall be <u>Be</u> responsible for the operation of all
7	departments, including by specification the Police and Fire Departments.
8	(m)(13) The Manager, under Under policies approved by the Select Board
9	members, shall have exclusive authority to appoint, fix the salaries of, suspend,
10	and remove, all officers and employees except those who are elected or who
11	are appointed by the Select Board members. When the managership Town
12	Manager position is vacant, this authority shall be exercised by the Select
13	Board.
14	(n)(b) The Town Manager may, when advisable or proper, delegate to
15	subordinate officers and employees of the Town, any duties conferred upon
16	him or her.
17	§ 405. COMPENSATION
18	The <u>Town</u> Manager shall receive such compensation as may be fixed by the
19	Select Board members.

1 § 406. REMOVAL

(a) On 90 days <u>days</u> written notice <u>from the Select Board</u>, the <u>Town</u>
Manager may be removed without cause by a majority of the Select Board
members so voting at a meeting called for the purpose of voting on removal.
During the <u>90 day 90-day</u> period, the <u>Town</u> Manager may be suspended with
pay.

7 (b) The Select Board members may adopt at any time a resolution stating 8 their its intention to remove the Town Manager and the reasons therefore, a 9 copy of which shall be sent to the <u>Town</u> Manager. The <u>Town</u> Manager may, 10 within 10 days after such notice is sent, request a hearing, which. The hearing 11 shall be held by the Select Board members not less than 10 days nor more than 12 20 days from the date of such request, after which the Select Board members 13 may dismiss the Town Manager. If no request for a hearing is filed in 14 accordance with the foregoing, the Select Board members may dismiss the 15 Town Manager immediately. During the period after the resolution of 16 intention is adopted and until the Town Manager's dismissal, he or she may be 17 suspended with pay. * * * 18

19 § 501. TAXES

Taxes shall be assessed by the Town based on the fair market value of real
 and personal property, in accordance with State law.

2	§ 503. FAIR MARKET VALUE OF REAL ESTATE
3	* * *
4	(c) When the fair market value of real estate is finally determined by $\frac{1}{2}$
5	State board or appraisers the Director of Property Valuation and Review (PVR)
6	or by a court having jurisdiction, then the value so fixed shall be the fair
7	market value of such real estate for the year for which such appeal is taken and
8	for the ensuing two years, unless the taxpayer's property is altered materially;
9	is damaged; or if the Town in which it is located has undergone a complete
10	revaluation of all taxable real estate, in the event of which, such fair market
11	value may be changed.
12	§ 504. SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS
13	Despite any contrary provision in general law, the Select Board members
14	may in their its sole discretion make a special assessment upon real estate for
15	the installation or construction of a public improvement, such special
16	assessment to be such proportion of the total cost of such improvement as the
17	benefit to a parcel of real estate bears to the total benefit resulting to the public
18	in general.
19	§ 505. TAX WITHIN BENNINGTON <u>RURAL</u> FIRE DISTRICT NO. 1
20	(a) The tax assessed by the Town on the grand list shall be reduced with
21	respect to real estate in the Bennington Rural Fire District No. 1. This

1	reduction shall be in direct proportion to the amount of the tax assessed by the
2	Town which that is used by the Town to provide fire protection services to
3	property not included in the Bennington <u>Rural</u> Fire District No. 1.
4	(b) The purpose of this amendment section is to make substantially uniform
5	the taxes assessed throughout the Town for fire protection furnished by all fire
6	departments in the Town. This tax reduction shall remain in effect until such
7	time as the Bennington Rural Fire District No. 1 dissolves itself or merges with
8	the Town of Bennington, in accordance with the charter of the Town of
9	Bennington.

11	§ 508. PURPOSES AND POWERS
12	(a) The District is created for the general purpose of maintaining and
13	improving the economic, social, cultural, and environmental vitality and
14	quality of the Town of Bennington (in particular, the District created by this
15	section 507 506 of this charter); to promote the Town and the District as a
16	regional retail, commercial, and service center; and to serve as an advocate for
17	the orderly development of the District in order to encourage expansion of the
18	retail, commercial, and service base of the District and the Town by attracting
19	new business and investment.
20	* * *
21	\$ 510 DISTRICT TAYES

21 § 510. DISTRICT TAXES

1	(a) District taxes are charges levied upon the owners of taxable properties
2	located in the District, excepting properties used exclusively for residential
3	purposes, which except for owner-occupied residential properties. The District
4	taxes shall be used to defray the expenses incurred in connection with for the
5	operation, maintenance, and repair of the District.
6	* * *
7	(d) In the case of any property used for both residential and nonresidential
8	purposes within the District as of April 1, the Board of Listers (Board) shall
9	adjust the listed value for the purposes of determining the District tax under
10	this section to exclude the value of that portion of the property used for owner-
11	occupied residential purposes. The Board shall determine the adjusted grand
12	list value of the business portion of the property and give notice of the same as
13	provided under 32 V.S.A. chapter 131. Any property owner may file a
14	grievance with the Board and appeal the decision of the Board as provided for
15	under 32 V.S.A. chapter 131; however, the filing of an appeal of the
16	determination of the Board and pendency of the appeal shall not vacate the lien
17	on the property assessed, and the District taxes must be paid and continue to be
18	paid as they become due.
10	\$ 511 LOCAL OPTION TAY

19 <u>§ 511. LOCAL OPTION TAX</u>

1	(a) If the Select Board by a majority vote recommends, the voters of the
2	Town may, at an annual or special meeting warned for the purpose, by a
3	majority vote of those present and voting, assess any or all of the following:
4	(1) a one percent meals tax;
5	(2) a one percent rooms tax;
6	(3) a one percent alcoholic beverages tax; or
7	(4) a one percent sales tax.
8	(b) Any local option tax assessed under subsection (a) of this section shall
9	be collected and administered and may be rescinded as provided by the general
10	laws of this State.
11	* * *
12	§ 601. ORDINANCES CONTINUE IN EFFECT
13	If at the time this charter becomes effective as the charter of the Town of
14	Bennington there is in force in any village or other area of the Town a zoning
15	ordinance, including billboard zoning, such ordinance shall continue in force
16	within the area for which it was originally enacted. Each such ordinance shall
17	be a valid and legal ordinance within such area and the same shall be and
18	become a valid and legal zoned area with such districts as are provided for in
19	said ordinance. [Repealed.]

1	§ 603. ADMINISTRATION OF ORDINANCE OF VILLAGES WHICH
2	THAT MERGE
3	When such villages cease to exist as aforesaid pursuant to this charter, the
4	Town legislative body Select Board, Board of Adjustment Development
5	Review Board, and Administrative Officer shall have jurisdiction of and
6	administer zoning in said the village area as a separate zoned area in
7	accordance with the provisions of the ordinance in force therein and the
8	general law. If no Town Administrative Officer and Board of Adjustment have
9	or Development Review Board has then been appointed by the legislative body
10	Select Board, that body the Select Board shall forthwith make such
11	appointment.
12	§ 604. COMPREHENSIVE TOWN ORDINANCE
13	The billboard zoning ordinance enacted for the area outside the villages in
14	the Town shall continue to be administered by the Town officials having
15	charge of zoning. When such Town officials having charge of zoning acquire
16	jurisdiction of the zoning ordinance in other zoned areas as herein provided in
17	this section, said the ordinances, together with said billboard zoning
18	ordinance, shall be deemed to be part of a general town Town zoning
19	ordinance duly and legally enacted in accordance with a comprehensive plan.
20	Such The general ordinance shall be subject to repeal, amendment, or
21	alteration by the Town under the application provisions of law.

2	§ 806. CHARTER REVIEW COMMITTEE
3	The At least once every five years, the Select Board may shall appoint a
4	Charter Review Committee of not less fewer than five nor more than nine
5	members of from among the inhabitants residents of the Town, said. The
6	Committee to shall review the charter and recommend such any changes
7	therein as it finds necessary or advisable for the purpose of improving the
8	operation of Town government. Said The Committee shall prepare a written
9	report of their recommended amendments to the charter its recommendations
10	in time for same those recommendations to be submitted to the Select Board
11	for review no later than one year after the appointment of said the Committee.
12	At the discretion of the Select Board such amendments, the recommendations
13	may be warned for ballot vote at an annual or special Town meeting to be held
14	no later than one year after the submission of the report. The Select Board
15	shall provide in their its budget for any year when a Charter Review
16	Committee is appointed, a sum of money funding for said the Committee.
