# Vermont Office of Professional Regulation Sunrise Review



## History of the Office of Professional Regulation (OPR)

- Created as an "umbrella agency" in 1989 for efficiency in professional licensing
- Professions were scattered, siloed, independent, and unaccountable
- Consolidation under one roof made sense for many reasons



## **History of Sunrise in Vermont:**

- Created in 1977, among the first in the nation
- Prior to the creation of OPR
- Review was in the hands of the legislative council and was rarely used. They did not have the staff or expertise
- OPR was created in 1989 and was given the power of sunrise review for all new professions



## Sunrise in other states:

- > Approximately 15 states
- Practices differ:
  - reviews done by legislative committees, executive offices, special boards or councils
  - detailed procedures versus broad authority guided by criteria
- Focused on public protection and cost/benefit analysis

## **VT Sunrise Reviews**

- A gatekeeper; the ability to slow down and do the analysis
- If it's not about public protection...don't do it!
- Based on facts and evidence, not emotion, marketplace, pride, or insurance reimbursement
- About the public interest, not special interests
- Empower legislators to defer avoid the fight





## VT Sunrise laws (26 V.S.A. § 3101)

It is the policy of the state of Vermont that regulation be imposed upon a profession or occupation **solely for the purpose of protecting the public**. The legislature believes that all individuals should be permitted to enter into a profession or occupation unless there is a **demonstrated need for the state to protect the interests of the public** by restricting entry into the profession or occupation. If such a need is identified, the form of regulation adopted by the state shall be **the least restrictive form of regulation necessary to protect the public interest**.



## VT Sunrise laws (26 V.S.A. § 3105)

Only regulate when:

- Unregulated practice can clearly endanger public health safety and welfare
- > Harm is not remote or speculative
- Public can reasonably expect to benefit from the regulation
- Public cannot be effectively protected by other means
- If necessary, the least restrictive regulation shall be imposed:
- Civil remedies and sanctions
- Regulate entities and facilities
- Registration > Certification > Licensure

## **VT Sunrise Applications**

- Due by July 1 from proponents of regulation
- > OPR seeks public comment, holds public hearings
- > Review other states, public harm, public benefit
- > OPR reports in January with a recommendation
- Ultimately the Legislature's decision



## **Sunrise Keys to Success**

- Relationships with legislators and committees of jurisdiction invest the time
- > A consistent, fair and transparent process
- Thoughtful, realistic recommendations based on input from all stakeholders
- Honest, unbiased conversations



## **VT Sunrise Examples**

- Landscape architects last in the nation
- Massage therapists every year for at least a decade
- Dog walkers stop it before it starts
- Foresters a difficult conversation
