



### Community Programs

Program	Description
Adult Outpatient (AOP)	Provides services for adults who do not have prolonged serious disabilities but who are experiencing emotional, behavioral, or adjustment problems severe enough to warrant professional attention
Community Rehabilitation and Treatment (CRT)*	Provides services for adults with severe and persistent mental illness
Children and Families (C&F)*	Provide services to children and families who are undergoing emotional or psychological distress or are having problems adjusting to changing life situations.
Emergency Services	Serves individuals who are experiencing an acute mental health crisis. These services are provided on a 24-hour a day, 7-day-per-week basis with both telephone and face-to-face services available as needed.
Advocacy and Peer Services	Broad array of support services provided by trained peers (a person who has experienced a mental health condition or psychiatric disability) or peermanaged organizations focused on helping individuals with mental health and other co-occurring conditions to support recovery







Secure Residential Program - providing services to adults to support recovery in a secure environment

providing individual support throughout the continuum of care

private, non-profit service providers that are responsible for ensuring needed services are available through program delivery, local planning, service coordination, and monitoring outcomes within their geographic region.


#### Specialized Services Agencies

# Vision 2030: 10-Year Plan

### Mental Health Related Legislative Reports

Act 79 (18 VSA 174 § 7256) requires the Department to submit an annual report regarding the extent to which individuals with a mental health condition or psychiatric disability receive care in the most integrated and least restrictive setting available.	Annually, on or before January 15
<b>Act 114</b> addresses three areas of mental-health law; the administration of nonemergency involuntary psychiatric medication in inpatient settings for people on orders of hospitalization, the administration of nonemergency involuntary psychiatric medication for adults on orders of non-hospitalization (community commitments), and continuation of ninety-day orders of non-hospitalization.	Annually, on or before January 15 (2020 extension to January 31 <sup>st</sup> )
<b>Act 26,</b> Sec. 2; Analysis of Residential Mental Health Needs requires Department of Mental Health shall evaluate and determine the mental health bed needs for residential programs across the State by - geographic area and provider type, including long-term residences (group homes), intensive residential recovery facilities, and secure residential recovery facilities.	January 15, 2020
<b>Act 72,</b> Section E.314.1- Success Beyond Six; Review, requires the Agency of Human Services, the Agency of Education, and Department of Mental Health shall assess and determine how to evaluate Success Beyond Six program spending against other competing priorities in the Medicaid program.	January 15, 2020
Act 113 (2016) Section 12, Act 82, Section 7 – Delivery System Reform Report	January 15, 2019, January 15, 2020, January 15, 2021

### Mental Health Related Legislative Reports

Act 200 (S.203) - An Act relating to system improvements of the Mental Health System  Section 7 — Requires the Commissioner to collect information from hospitals in the State that have either an inpatient psychiatric unit or emergency department receiving patients with psychiatric health needs.	January 31 <sup>st</sup> , annually for three years (2019-2021)
Section 10 - Institutions for Mental Disease	On or before January 15 of each year from 2019 to 2025
