

H57 emulates the past and current abortion practice here in Vermont- access to unrestricted and unregulated abortions under Roe vs. Wade. The Vermont Democrats are just putting what is currently (and quietly) practiced into Vermont Law. Id. § 664(1). Rights and responsibilities are comprised of 'physical responsibility,' and 'legal responsibility,' defined as 'the rights and responsibilities to determine and control various matters affecting a child's welfare...includ[ing] but... not limited to education, medical and dental care, religion and travel arrangements.' Id. § 664(1)(A)."
