10 (B) As used in this subdivision (4), the expansion of a
11 prekindergarten education program means an increase in the number of
12 children served in the program where the increase would require additional
13 teachers or classrooms.

14 (C) If a private or public prekindergarten provider is interested in
15 beginning or expanding a prekindergarten program, it shall give notice to, and
16 complete a regional needs assessment with, the local Building Bright Futures
17 Council, any private and public providers located within the geographical
18 region of the supervisory union in which the provider is located or intends to
19 be located, and any public or private provider which the provider has
20 contracted to pay for, or provide, prekindergarten education. The assessment
21 process shall include a least one public hearing. At the conclusion of the

1 assessment process, the provider that is interested in beginning or expanding a
2 prekindergarten program shall decide whether to begin or expand the program
3 and shall, within five calendar days of making its decision, inform each of the
4 providers to which it provided notice under this subdivision (C) of its decision
5 and the rationale for its decision.
