2	The Committee on General, Housing, and Military Affairs to which was
3	referred Senate Bill No. 23 entitled "An act relating to increasing minimum
4	wage" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends
5	that the House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended by striking out
6	Sec. 3, Child Care Financial Assistance Program; sliding scale, in its entirety,
7	and inserting in lieu thereof a new Sec. 3 and Sec. 3a as follows:
8	Sec. 3. CHILD CARE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
9	(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly that investments and initiatives
10	set forth in this act are meant to compliment the anticipated redesign of the
11	Child Care Financial Assistance Program, which shall be monitored by the
12	General Assembly.
13	(b) In fiscal year 2020, \$1,250,000.00 is appropriated from the General
14	Fund to the Department for Children and Families' Child Development
15	Division to restore the base for the Child Care Financial Assistance Program
16	(CCFAP) and \$6,900,000.00 is appropriated from the General Fund to the
17	Division for the purpose of adjusting the sliding fee scale and reimbursement
18	rates in CCFAP as follows:
19	(1) adjust the sliding fee scale of CCFAP to ensure that families whose
20	gross income is up to 100 percent of the current federal poverty guidelines
21	receive 100 percent of the available benefit and that families whose gross

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1	income is between 100 and 300 percent of the current federal poverty
2	guidelines receive between 99 and 10 percent of the available financial
3	assistance benefit, scaling between set eligibility levels as follows:
4	(A) 95 percent of the available financial assistance benefit for
5	families at 125 percent of the current federal poverty guidelines;
6	(B) 75 percent of the available financial assistance benefit for
7	families at 150 percent of the current federal poverty guidelines;
8	(C) 50 percent of the available financial assistance benefit for
9	families at 200 percent of the current federal poverty guidelines; and
10	(D) 10 percent of the available financial assistance benefit for
11	families at 300 percent of the current federal poverty guidelines; and
12	(2) align rates of reimbursement for preschool and school age children
13	participating in CCFAP in fiscal year 2020 with the market rates reported on
14	the 2015 Vermont Market Rate Survey and maintain rates of reimbursement
15	for infants and toddlers participating in CCFAP in fiscal year 2020 with the
16	market rates reported on the 2017 Vermont Market Rate Survey.
17	Sec. 3a. 33 V.S.A. § 3512(a)(4) is added to read:
18	(4) Beginning on January 1, 2025 and each subsequent year the
19	minimum wage is increased thereafter, the Commissioner for Children and
20	Families shall amend the Department for Children and Families' Child Care
21	Financial Assistance Program to:

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1	(A) adjust the sliding scale to correspond with each minimum wage
2	increase required pursuant to 21 V.S.A. § 384(a)(1) in order to ensure that the
3	benefit percentage at each new minimum wage level is not lower than the
4	percentage applied under the former minimum wage; and
5	(B) adjust the rate of reimbursement paid to providers on behalf of
6	families participating in the Child Care Financial Assistance Program in a
7	manner that offsets the estimated increased cost of child care in Vermont
8	resulting from an increase in the minimum wage required pursuant to
9	<u>21 V.S.A. § 384(a)(1).</u>
