

Over 38% of Vermonters live in our urban and community forest.





Program Mission

To lead citizens, businesses, and governments in understanding the value of urban and community forests and promote civic responsibility for and participation in the stewardship of these resources for this and future generations.

We provide:

- Financial Assistance
- Technical Assistance
- Information and Education




Program Impact (2019)

- **110 communities** received direct educational, technical and financial assistance.
- 452,128 Vermonters benefited from our program.
- **17,425 hours of community service** provided by our network of trained volunteers.







Program impact in 2019:

- 27 workshops
- 45 towns assisted in EAB planning
- \$40,000 in community grants for ash management (FPR)
- 41 Volunteer Forest Pest First Detectors trained


