7	operate an ATV on the VASA Trail System, on State land designated by the
8	Secretary pursuant to subdivision 3506(b)(4) of this title, or along any highway
9	that is not adjacent to the property of the operator unless the ATV:
10	(A) is registered pursuant to this title or in accordance with
11	subsection (e) of this section; and
12	(B) displays a valid VASA Trail Access Decal (TAD).
13	(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1) of this subsection, neither
14	registration nor display of a TAD is required to operate an ATV:
15	(A) on On the property of the owner of the ATV;
16	(B) in In a ski area, off the highway, for the purpose of grooming
17	snow, maintenance, or in rescue operations;.
18	(C) for For official use by a federal, State, or municipal agency if the
19	ATV is identified with the name or seal of the agency in a manner approved by
20	the Commissioner <del>; or</del> .

1	(D) on On privately owned land when the operator is specifically
2	invited to do so by the owner of the property and carries the written consent of
3	the owner.
4	(E) On frozen bodies of water as designated by the Agency of
5	Natural Resources under the provisions of 10 V.S.A. § 2607. Notwithstanding
6	subdivision 3506(b)(16) of this title, protective headgear is not required when
7	an ATV is operated on a frozen body of water pursuant to this subdivision.
