

LRTP Purpose and Context

- Sets broad priorities for transportation decision-making and investments on 20-year horizon. Not a project list.
- 2. Addresses changes in federal policies; required by Title 23 U.S.C. Highways Sec. 135.
- 3. Updated periodically to ensure we are on the right track in terms of policies and investment priorities.





Process and Approach

Aimed for a focused, succinct document, wellaligned with Strategic Plan and other AOT docs

Utilized existing outreach channels to solicit public input – RPC partners

AOT Staff Stakeholder Group– AOT program managers and SMEs

External Stakeholder Group – State agencies, advocates, operators, planning & development agencies

Winter 2018

Develop draft LRTP including goals, objectives, and strategies

Summer 2018

Publish draft LRTP for comment and adopt upon completion

Stakeholders Mtg #2 to review regional TAC input and develop LRTP themes and focus areas Fall 2017 Stakeholders Mtg #3 and visit RPC Transportation Advisory Committees to review Draft LRTP including goals, objectives, and strategies

"A safe, reliable and multimodal transportation system that supports economic growth, is affordable to use and operate, and serves vulnerable populations."








Outreach feedback themes

Vulnerable users in highway safety-bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure = economic opportunity, promotes health, creates community

Emphasize recreation-related tourism (NEK, LVRT)

Consistent support for public transit and passenger rail

Observed improvement in road surface conditions and appreciation for district maintenance

Continue to focus on asset management and maintaining existing infrastructure

Address Connected and Autonomous Vehicles (CAV); DMV plays key role licensing, testing, enforcement

Emphasize information technology / ITS for system management
