

Vermont Prison Population

1,719 (w/feds)
1,668 (state)

There are 1,297 males and 145 females housed in Vermont prisons; there are currently 277 males housed in privately-owned prisons out of state (Mississippi)

Inmates are ineligible to transfer to out-of-state housing if they are:

- receiving MAT (92 F, 567 M)
- detainees (380 state, 51 fed)
- receiving chronic care (specific cases)



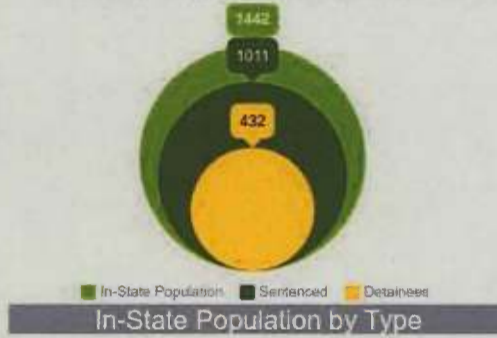
Housing Point in Time Analysis August 28, 2019

Male facilities have 1,419 and female facilities have 177 total beds for inmates



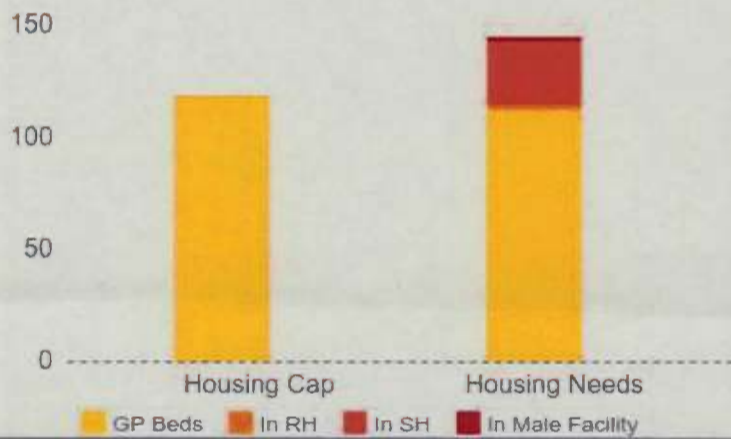
All Facilities: Housing Cap by Type

For the women's facility, there are only 6 unused GP beds



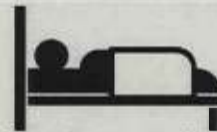
ACA Housing Standards: 10% bed availability. Vermont should have ~15 extra beds for females, 157 for males



Male Facilities: Housing Needs



Our in-state male GP bed space utilization is at 105% of capacity; when including out-of-state housing, GP utilization is at 136%



48 inmates are without a GP bed (booking, RH awaiting placement); 39 inmates are using sled beds

Additional Housing Info



There are only 15 home detention cases



Northern State Correctional Facility (NSCF) is currently under construction



NSCF can house 22 additional inmates post construction



Total deferred maintenance (as of 2014): \$11,942,702



Work Camp eligibility continues to decline
