A sampling of Vermont Access Management Organization mission statements.

Brattleboro Community Television:

Brattleboro Community Television is a community media center serving eight towns in southeastern Vermont. Our mission is to promote civic engagement and transparency, and to empower community members to share their knowledge, views and creativity, without prejudice.

Catamount Access Television Corporation:

Catamount Access Television Corporation (CAT-TV) is a non-profit corporation organized for the following purposes:

- Enable, support and promote the production and distribution of PEG access television programs by and for educational, charitable, social service, religious, governmental, electoral or other non-profit organizations; residents of, or members of a group which operate primarily within Bennington County and contiguous areas.
- Distribute these programs on its PEG access cable television channels and other publicly accessible telecommunication networks or facilities, as it deems appropriate.
- Provide for the care and custody of equipment, facilities and programs owned or used by CAT-TV.
- Seek and receive grants from public and private sources in order to meet the expenses of the aforesaid purposes.
- Exercise any other rights or responsibilities incidental to or associated with applicable law.

Greater Northshire Access Television:

To provide public access to media technologies, equipment, training and local information for our regional community.

Kingdom Access Television:

To encourage and create community based TV programming and media, by and for the communities we serve. Promoting free speech, education and democracy concepts from area individuals and institutions through a non-profit, non-editorialized vision – To remain free from adverting, political or other influences.

Lake Champlain Access Television:

Lake Champlain Access Television is committed to serving the needs of our member communities by providing a free forum for the expression and exchange of ideas and information, a link to local government and schools, and a resource for education and training.

Onion River Community Access Media:

The mission of ORCA Media is to promote participation in local government, community and organizations through the use of telecommunications technology. ORCA Media provides free video production, training and distribution services to citizens and organizations in the towns served by ORCA Media and is dedicated to the principles of free speech, content neutrality, localism, civic engagement and tolerance of diverse opinions and perspectives.
