10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

12	Subchapter 3. Neonicotinoid-Treated Article Seed
13	<u>§ 661. DEFINITIONS</u>
14	As used in this subchapter:
15	(1) "Neonicotinoid pesticide" or "neonicotinoid" has the same meaning
16	as in section 911 of this title.
17	(2) "Neonicotinoid-treated article seed" means an agricultural seed,
18	flower seed, or vegetable seed that is a treated article pesticide and that has
19	been treated with a neonicotinoid pesticide.

1	(3) "Treated article" or "treated article pesticide" shall have the same
2	meaning as "treated article" in section 1101 of this title.
3	<u>§ 662. PROHIBITION</u>
4	Except as provided for in section 663 of this title, a person shall not sell,
5	offer for sale, distribute, or use a neonicotinoid-treated article seed in the State.
6	§ 663. AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY USE
7	The Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets may authorize the sale,
8	offer for sale, distribution, or use of a treated article seed upon a determination
9	that a threat to Vermont crops exists that requires the use of a neonicotinoid-
10	treated article seed and no other pesticide or class of pesticides would be
11	effective in addressing the threat.

9	(f)(1) The Secretary shall register as a restricted use pesticide any
10	neonicotinoid pesticide labeled as approved for outdoor use that is distributed,
11	sold, sold into, or offered for sale within the State or delivered for
12	transportation or transported in intrastate commerce or between points within
13	this State through any point outside this State, provided that the Secretary shall
14	not register the following products as restricted use pesticides, unless classified
15	under federal law as restricted use products:
16	(1)(A) pet care products used for preventing, destroying, repelling, or
17	mitigating fleas, mites, ticks, heartworms, or other insects or organisms;
18	(2)(B) personal care products used for preventing, destroying, repelling,
19	or mitigating lice or bedbugs; and
20	(3)(C) indoor pest control products used for preventing, destroying,
