14	Sec. 2. 16 V.S.A. § 1264 is amended to read:	
15	§ 1264. FOOD PROGRAM	
16	* * *	
17	(d) It is a goal of the State that by the year 2022 school boards operating a	
18	school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program shall purchase at least 20	
19	percent of all food for those programs from local producers.	
20	(e)(1) On or before December 31, 2020, and annually thereafter, a school	
21	board operating a school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program shall	

1	submit to the Agency of Education an estimate of the percentage of locally
2	produced foods that were purchased by the school board for those programs.
3	(2) On or before January 31, 2021, and annually thereafter, the Agency
4	of Education shall submit to the Senate Committees on Agriculture and on
5	Education and the House Committees on Agriculture and Forestry and on
6	Education in an aggregated form the information received from school boards
7	regarding the percentage of locally produced foods that are purchased as part
8	of a school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program. The provisions of 2
9	V.S.A. § 20(d) regarding expiration of required reports shall not apply to the
10	report required by this subdivision.

13	(a) It is a goal of the State that by the year 2022 at least 20 percent of all
14	foods purchased by school districts and supervisory unions be locally produced
15	foods. School boards have the discretion to define what foods are included
16	within the definition of "locally produced foods" for the purposes of this
17	subsection and subsection (b) of this section.
18	(b) On or before December 31, 2020 and annually thereafter, a school
19	board operating a school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program shall
20	report to the Agency of Education an estimate of the percentage of the cost of

1	all foods purchased by the school board for those programs that were locally	
2	produced foods during the one-year period ending on August 31 of that year.	
3	(c)(1) Beginning with the 2020–21 school year and thereafter, school	
4	districts shall be eligible for a local foods incentive grant (grant) from funds	
5	appropriated to the Agency of Education for this purpose.	
6	(2) A school district may apply for the grant if it has:	
7	(A) developed a locally produced foods' purchasing plan, which	
8	describes the district's goals for purchasing locally produced foods and its plan	
9	to achieve those goals;	
10	(B) designated an individual as the food coordinator for locally	
11	produced foods who shall be responsible for implementing the locally

1	the school district satisfies the conditions under subdivision (2) of this

3	(4) If a school district is eligible for a grant under subdivision (3) of this
4	subsection (c), then the Agency shall make the grant payment, subject to
5	appropriation, on or before the following March 31 after submission of the
6	school district's application, (which is due on or before January 15 of that
7	year), which shall be equal to 15 cents per plate served through the district's
8	school lunch program for the one-year period ending August 31 of the prior
9	year. A school district may apply for this grant and receive this grant funding
10	only once.
11	(5)(A) A school district that has received a grant under subdivision (4)
12	of this subsection (c) may, on or before January 15, 2023 or January 15 of any
13	year thereafter, apply for a further grant by submitting to the Agency of
14	Education information that demonstrates that at least 15 percent of the cost of
15	all foods purchased or grown, raised, or produced by the school district during
16	the one year period ending on August 31 of the previous year, excluding foods
17	purchased or grown, raised, or produced by the school district that were used to
18	provide catering services for which the school district received compensation,
19	was in aggregate:

1	(i) fruits, vegetables, meat, poultry, dairy, maple syrup, or eggs
2	that were grown, raised or produced in Vermont or within 30 miles of the
3	Vermont border; and
4	(ii) foods processed in Vermont with at least 75 percent Vermont-
5	grown, Vermont-raised, or Vermont-produced ingredients, with fluid milk
6	counted as a processed food.
7	(B) If a school district grows, raises, or produces food, it shall assign
8	a fair market value to that food for the purpose of reporting its cost.
9	(6) If a school district is eligible for a grant under subdivision (5) of this
10	subsection (c), the Agency shall, on or before the following March 31 after
11	submission of the school district's application, (which is due on or before
12	January 15 of that year), make the grant payment, subject to appropriation,
13	which shall be determined as follows:
14	(A) 15 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for
15	school districts purchasing at least 15 percent or more locally produced foods;
16	(B) 20 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for
17	school districts purchasing at least 20 percent or more locally produced foods;
18	<u>or</u>
19	(C) 25 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for
20	school districts purchasing at least 25 percent or more locally produced foods.

1	(7) A school district may apply for and receive grant funding under

4	(8) The Agency of Education may perform sample audits for any year

6	subsection (c) to verify that information provided to the Agency under

8	grant payment under subdivision (6) to a school district that was based on	
9	inaccurate information reported by the school district, the Agency may seek	
10	reimbursement from the district for an overpayment or reimburse the district	
11	for an underpayment, or may adjust future grant amounts under this section to	
12	reflect the over- or underpayment.	
13	(d)(1) On or before January 31, 2021 and annually thereafter, the Agency	
14	of Education shall submit to the Senate Committees on Agriculture and on	
15	Education and the House Committees on Agriculture and Forestry and on	
16	Education in an aggregated form:	
17	(A) the information received from school districts regarding the	
18	percentage of locally produced foods, as school districts define them, that were	
19	reported under subsection (b) of this section; and	
20	(B) the percentage of locally produced foods, using the grant funding	
21	definition, that were reported under subdivision (c)(5) of this section, and the	

1	amount of grant funding paid to school districts under subdivision (c)(6) in the
2	prior school year.
3	(2) The provisions of 2 V.S.A. § 20(d) regarding expiration of required
4	reports shall not apply to the reports required by this subsection.
5	Sec. 4. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT
6	(a) The Agency of Education shall collaborate with the Agency of
7	Agriculture, Food and Markets to promote the local foods program under
8	16 V.S.A. § 1264a to school districts, farmers, food processors, and
9	distributors.
10	(b) The following position is created in the Agency of Education: one full-
11	time, classified position specializing in the administration of school food
12	programs to assist school districts with expanding access to locally produced
13	foods. The position established in this subsection shall be transferred and
14	converted from an existing vacant position in the Executive Branch of State
15	government. There is appropriated to the Agency of Education from the
16	General Fund for fiscal year 2021 the amount of \$125,000.00 for salary,
17	benefits, and operating expenses.
18	Sec. 5. APPROPRIATIONS FOR FOOD PROGRAMS
19	(a) There is appropriated to the Agency of Education from the General
20	Fund for fiscal year 2021 the amount of \$75,000.00 for the summer food
21	service program under 16 V.S.A. § 1264(a)(2).

1	(b) There is appropriated to the Agency of Education from the General
2	Fund for fiscal year 2021 the amount of \$[] for local foods incentive grants
3	under 16 V.S.A. § 1264a (Locally Produced Foods) as added by this act.
4	Sec. 6. CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES
5	(a) It is a goal of the State that by the year 2023 at least 20 percent of all
6	foods purchased for meals served in correctional facilities shall be locally
7	produced foods. As used in this section, "locally produced foods" mean:
8	(1) fruits, vegetables, meat, poultry, dairy, maple syrup, or eggs that are
9	grown, raised, or produced in Vermont or within 30 miles of the Vermont
10	border; and
11	(2) foods processed in Vermont with at least 75 percent Vermont-grown
12	Vermont-raised, or Vermont-produced ingredients, with fluid milk counted as
13	a processed food.
14	(b) On or before January 31, 2021 and annually thereafter, the Department
15	of Corrections shall report to the House Committees on Agriculture and
16	Forestry and on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committees on
17	Agriculture and on Institutions the estimated percentage of locally produced
18	foods purchased by correctional facilities during the previous fiscal year.
19	Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on passage.
