The need for those services has decreased over time, probably due to more, short-term, rehabilitative stays vs. long-term placements. The adjustment reflects the actual need as demonstrated over time.

When creating a future budget, DAIL relies on point-in-data enrollment data, which is not necessarily an accurate predictor of the future budget needs for TBI services. Additionally, people on the TBI program who require long-term services may shift over to the Choices for Care program to meet their long-term needs.
