10	based, fixed voice service that is not line-powered and to electric companies
11	for the purpose of enabling the E-911 Board to assess 911 service availability
12	during such outages. An outage for purposes of this section includes any loss
13	of E-911 calling capacity, whether caused by lack of function of the
14	telecommunications subscriber's backup-power equipment, lack of function
15	within an outage in a telecommunications provider's system network, or an
16	outage in the electric power system. For purposes of this section, an outage in
17	a telecommunications provider's network includes the failure of backup power
18	equipment that is owned and controlled solely by the telecommunications
19	provider or a loss of 911 service availability resulting from lack of function or
20	failure of equipment on a subscriber's premises that the provider installed to
21	enable network connectivity. The rule shall incorporate the threshold criteria

1	established under 47 C.F.R. Part 4, § 4.9(e) as it pertains to outage reporting
2	requirements applicable to wireless service providers. The E-911 Board shall
3	file a final proposed rule with the Secretary of State and with the Legislative
4	Committee on Administrative Rules pursuant to 3 V.S.A. § 841 on or before
5	February 1, 2020 September 30, 2020.
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
