Subject: Co-Sponsoring of S.3569, Keeping Critical Connections Act

Erica,

Critical Connections Act, introduced on March 23 by Senators Amy Klobuchar and Kevin Cramer. This bill would help ensure that smaller broadband operators like Waitsfield and Champlain Valley Telecom can sustain essential broadband connections for customers unable to pay their bills due to a loss or reduction in income related to the COVID-19 crisis. It will also allow us to offer free service or broadband upgrades to households with students in need of distance learning capability. Stated again, in a simpler way, this bill will help us recover the cost of providing service to low income customers that are unable to pay and for free service for students without a broadband connection.

This is so important that we are doing this now, not knowing if we will recoup any of our cost of keeping fellow Vermonter connected. I cannot stress the importance of being connected, especially in times of crisis like we are experiencing now.

Further, it would be great if you could join in your support with Representative Peter Welch who introduced the House bill on March 25 with Roger Marshall.
