Joel Moskowitz, PhD, of the School of Public Health at the University of California Berkeley, has published a compendium of peer reviewed studies that are relevant to questions you may have about the safety of electromagnetic radiation in general and 5G in particular: www.saferemr.com A good overview is provided by his op-ed in Scientific American in October 2019: <https://www.saferemr.com/2019/10/5G-Scientific-American.html>

I know that we are told that the Telecommunications Act of 1996 precludes any government agency turning down a telecommunications antenna based on health concerns, but there are other avenues beyond rejecting citing applications for the legislature to stop the deployment of 5G.

See the August 9, 2019 [decision](#) by the DC Circuit Court of Appeals, which vacated the FCC's deregulation of small wireless telecommunications facilities (sWTFs) because the FCC was 'arbitrary and capricious' in determining that sWTFs don't require review.

Your hands are not tied. Please don't let the telecom lobbyists run roughshod over your decision making process. There is too much at stake here.
