4 Subject: Human services; substance misuse prevention

5 Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a  
6 Substance Misuse Prevention Advisory Council to replace the Alcohol and  
7 Drug Abuse Council. It also proposes to establish a Director of Substance  
8 Misuse Prevention. The bill proposes to eliminate the Tobacco Evaluation and  
9 Review Board and rename the Controlled Substances and Pain Management  
10 Advisory Council to be the Vermont Prescription Monitoring System Advisory  
11 Council.

12 An act relating to substance misuse prevention

13 It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

14 \* \* \* Legislative Intent \* \* \*

15 Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

16 It is the intent of the General Assembly:

17 (1) to explore revenue generated by the taxation of substances such as  
18 cannabis, tobacco, tobacco substitutes, and alcohol for the purpose of funding  
19 substance misuse prevention initiatives throughout the State; and





1 purposes of this section. The Commissioner and the Council shall consider  
2 additional circumstances under which health care providers should be required  
3 to query the VPMS, including whether health care providers should be  
4 required to query the VPMS prior to writing a prescription for any opioid  
5 Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance or when a patient requests renewal  
6 of a prescription for an opioid Schedule II, III, or IV controlled substance  
7 written to treat acute pain, and the Commissioner may adopt rules accordingly.

13 Subchapter 1. Director of Substance Misuse Prevention

14 § 4800. DIRECTOR OF SUBSTANCE MISUSE PREVENTION

15 There is created the permanent position of Director of Substance Misuse  
16 Prevention within the Office of the Secretary in the Agency of Human Services  
17 for the purpose of directing and coordinating systemic trauma-informed  
18 prevention strategies across State government and in collaboration with  
19 community partners. The Director shall have either a masters-level degree  
20 specific to substance use disorder or public health or appropriate professional  
21 experience or both.

11       ~~(h) Each member of the Council not otherwise receiving compensation from~~  
12       ~~the State of Vermont or any political subdivision thereof shall be entitled to~~  
13       ~~receive per diem compensation as provided in 32 V.S.A. § 1010(b) for not~~  
14       ~~more than six meetings annually. Each member shall be entitled to his or her~~  
15       ~~actual and necessary expenses.~~

16       (a) Creation. There is created the Substance Misuse Prevention Advisory  
17       Council within the Department of Health for the purpose of consolidating  
18       oversight of substance misuse prevention programs across the Department  
19       and for providing advice to the Commissioner for improving prevention  
20       policies and programming throughout the State. The Advisory Council's

1 prevention initiatives shall encompass all substances at risk of misuse,  
2 including tobacco, tobacco substitutes, cannabis, opioids, and alcohol.

3 (b) Membership. The Advisory Council shall be composed of:

4 (1) the Secretary of Education or designee;

5 (2) the Commissioner of Public Safety or designee; and

6 (3) seven members who are appointed by the Secretary of Human  
7 Services and who collectively offer expertise in the following disciplines:

8 (A) substance misuse prevention in a professional setting;

9 (B) pediatric care specific to substance misuse prevention or  
10 substance use disorder;

11 (C) academic research pertaining to substance misuse prevention or  
12 behavioral addiction treatment;

13 (D) education specific to substance misuse prevention;

14 (E) child and family trauma prevention and resilience development;

15 (F) law enforcement, criminal justice, or highway safety; and

16 (G) community outreach or collaboration in the field of substance  
17 misuse prevention.

18 (c) Powers and duties. The Advisory Council shall strengthen the State's  
19 response to the substance use disorder crisis by advancing evidence-based  
20 and evidence-informed substance misuse prevention initiatives. The  
21 Advisory Council's duties shall include:

1           (1) reviewing and making recommendations on best practices to assist  
2           communities to significantly reduce the demand for substances through  
3           prevention and education;

4           (2) reviewing substance misuse prevention program evaluations and  
5           making specific recommendations for modification based on the results;

6           (3) reviewing existing State health, mental health, and drug and  
7           alcohol addiction laws, rules, policies, and programs and proposing changes  
8           to eliminate redundancy and to eliminate barriers experienced by  
9           communities in coordinating preventative action with State government; and

10          (4) reviewing existing community-based recreation, afterschool, and  
11          parent-child center programs to determine a foundation of connection and  
12          support for all Vermont children and youth.

13          (d) Subcommittees. The Advisory Council shall have the ability to create  
14          issue-specific subcommittees for the purpose of carrying out its duties. Any  
15          subcommittees created may draw on the expertise of any individual  
16          regardless of whether that individual is a member of the Advisory Council.

17          (e) Assistance. The Advisory Council shall have the administrative,  
18          technical, and legal assistance of Substance Misuse Prevention Manager  
19          established pursuant to section 4804 of this title.

20          (f) Report. Annually on or before January 1, the Advisory Council shall  
21          submit a written report to the Governor, the House Committees on

1     Appropriations and on Human Services, and the Senate Committees on  
2     Appropriations and on Health and Welfare with its findings and any  
3     recommendations for legislative action.

4         (g) Organization.

5             (1) The Secretary of Human Services or designee and the substance  
6     misuse prevention professional shall serve as co-chairs of the Advisory  
7     Council.

8             (2) Members of the Advisory Council shall serve two-year terms. Any  
9     vacancy on the Advisory Council shall be filled in the same manner as the  
10    original appointment. The replacement member shall serve for the remainder  
11    of the unexpired term.

12            (3) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.

13            (h) Compensation and reimbursement. Other members of the Advisory  
14    Council shall be entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement of  
15    expenses as permitted under 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for not more than six  
16    meetings. Payments to members of the Advisory Council authorized under  
17    this subsection shall be made from monies appropriated to the Department of  
18    Health.

3 § 9505. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES

4 The ~~Board~~ Department shall have all the powers necessary and convenient  
5 to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of this section, and  
6 shall:

7 (1) ~~Establish jointly with the Department of Health~~ the selection criteria  
8 for community grants and review and recommend the grants to be funded.

9 (2) ~~Select, upon the advice of the Commissioner,~~ a contractor  
10 responsible for countermarketing activities. The Department shall pay the fees  
11 and costs of any such contractor. ~~The Board and Commissioner shall jointly~~

9 contributed from any outside sources that are designated for purposes of  
10 reducing tobacco use.

11           (8) In collaboration with the Agency ~~and Department~~, organize a  
12 minimum of two public meetings by September 15 of each year, to receive  
13 public input and advice for setting program priorities and establishing an  
14 annual program budget.

15           (9) Conduct jointly with the Secretary a review of the ~~Department's~~  
16 proposed annual budget for the program, including funds contributed from any  
17 outside sources that are designated for purposes of reducing tobacco use, and  
18 submit independent recommendations to the Governor, Joint Fiscal  
19 Committee, and House and Senate Committees on Appropriations by  
20 October 1 of each year.

1           (10) Propose ~~to the Department~~ strategies for program coordination and  
2           collaboration with other State agencies, health care providers and  
3           organizations, community and school groups, nonprofit organizations  
4           dedicated to anti-tobacco activities, and other nonprofit organizations.

8           § 9506. ALLOCATION SYSTEM

9           (a) In determining the allocation of funds available for the purposes of this  
10          chapter, the Department ~~and the Board~~ shall consider all relevant factors,  
11          including:

12               (1) the level of funding or other participation by private or public  
13          sources in the activity being considered for funding;

14               (2) what resources will be required in the future to sustain the program;

15               (3) geographic distribution of funds; and

16               (4) the extent to which the goals of the project can be measured by  
17          reductions in adult or youth smoking rates.

18          (b) The Department's ~~and Board's~~ allocation system shall include a  
19          method, developed jointly, that evaluates the need for and impact and quality  
20          of the activities proposed by eligible applicants, including, if appropriate,

1 measuring the results of the project through reductions in adult and youth  
2 smoking rates.

3 § 9507. ANNUAL REPORT

4 (a) On or before January 15 of each year, the ~~Board~~ Department shall  
5 submit a report concerning its activities under this chapter to the Governor and  
6 the General Assembly. The report shall include, to the extent possible, the  
7 following:

8 (1) the results of the independent program evaluation, beginning with  
9 the report filed on January 15, 2003, and then each year thereafter;

10 (2) a full financial report of the activities of the Departments of Health  
11 and of Liquor Control, and the Agency of Education, ~~and the Board~~, including  
12 a special accounting of all activities from July 1 through December 31 of the

19 Sec. 7. INVENTORY; SUBSTANCE MISUSE PREVENTION SERVICES

20 (a) On or before January 1, 2021, the Manager of Substance Misuse

21 Prevention established pursuant to 18 V.S.A. § 4804, in consultation with the

1 Director of Substance Misuse Prevention established pursuant to 18 V.S.A.  
2 § 4800, shall develop and submit to the House Committee on Human Services  
3 and to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare an inventory of substance  
4 misuse prevention programs in the State. The Director shall include in the  
5 inventory:

- 6 (1) the estimated cost of each program;  
7 (2) the geographic reach of each program;  
8 (3) the effectiveness of each program; and  
9 (4) any identified gaps in services.

10 (b) On or before January 1, 2020, the Manager shall submit an interim  
11 report to the House Committee on Human Services and to the Senate  
12 Committee on Health and Welfare regarding its progress and findings related  
13 to subsection (a) of this section.

15 Sec. 8. APPROPRIATION; EVIDENCE-BASED EDUCATION AND  
16 ADVERTISING FUND

17 In fiscal year 2020, up to \$400,000.00 may be appropriated from the  
18 Evidence-Based Education and Advertising Fund established pursuant to 33  
19 V.S.A. § 2004a to the Department of Health for the purpose of funding the  
20 prevention of prescription drug misuse efforts undertaken by the Substance  
21 Misuse Prevention Advisory Council established in 18 V.S.A. § 4803.
