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#### Written Testimony

#### Micro Business Development Program

The Micro Business Development Program (MBDP) of the Vermont Community Action Agencies provides training, coaching, and access to financing for low-to-moderate-income Vermonters who are planning to start or expand a microenterprise. Since 1988, MBDP has helped to strengthen the economic self-sufficiency of more than 10,000 Vermonters. We have launched or expanded more than 2,100 Vermont businesses, created thousands of jobs, and helped entrepreneurs leverage more than \$15 million in financing. We also provide the skillful, individualized support that our clients need. The proposed budget for 2021 completely cuts out the Office of Economic Opportunity's funding for the Micro Business Development Program.

We surveyed our recent Micro Business Development Program clients. 15 responded to the question: "What types of support have your received from the Micro Business Development Program, both from your coach and from workshops":

Found out about resources I did not know about (grants, shared working spaces, loans, etc.)	73.33%
Built my confidence	73.33%
Took steps I would not have taken on my own	66.67%
Applied for funding	40.00%
Launched my business	33.33%
Grew my client base	33.33%
Expanded my business	26.67%

We also asked them to describe their business successes related to MBDP, how they feel about working with their business coach, and why they would recommend the program to other entrepreneurs. They responded:

I am proud of developing my business and marketing plans for my business and of the help with the IDA program that **really got my business off the ground** later after it was getting established. Without the microbusiness program I would not have been able to start my own business.

Simeon has the most amazing insight into helping people grow their businesses and brainstorm ideas that really made a difference in my business. He also helped me think outside of the box when making business connections and looking for contracts.

I would say that the Micro Business program helps people develop ideas into businesses and turn dreams into reality by helping you develop sound business and marketing plans and goals to grow your business. ... It is an invaluable support system that allows small businesses to grow and thrive. This is what Vermont is based upon: the small business that is driven by sound economic practices and

ideas to create amazing products and services while building Vermont's economy. This is a win win for both new businesses and Vermont.

It took me one year to complete the program, but I accomplished so much. I have a better understanding of the financial piece of the business process. He had me write out how much everything I sold cost to make sure I was earning enough and in some cases, I was not. When I started I always questioned and felt uncomfortable talking about how much I charge for prints or services, but now I'm so much more confident. I have come so far!

You need a cheerleader when you're starting a business. It's terrifying for most people. John was a great coach. He was honest and didn't give me false hope. It was fun to see him get excited to see how far my business had progressed since first meeting him. I am someone who needs a 1 on 1 coach. I don't feel comfortable in classrooms to ask for help. This set up is ideal. You can take a few classes, but you get a 1 on 1 coach who you can get to know and trust. I could email him whenever with any questions. I would like to continue to be able to do so!

If you're starting any kind of business, it is so important to have these resources available for people. For me, this is what I feel is best, and anyone would benefit from this program as long as they took it seriously. I'd truly would have been lost without it.

I have two recent accomplishments that I am proud of. One is working through the painful process of restructuring both my personal and business finances. My business coach, John Gergely, was instrumental in guiding me through that. I could not have done it without him. The other is having my first solo art show. Workshops that I have taken through the Micro Business Development Program have given me more confidence and information on how to make good financial choices. The Micro Business Development Program can prepare you in ways to start or expand your business that you may not have think of. They have excellent Business Counselors that support and encourage you along the way. They are a wealth of knowledge, work tirelessly and make you feel valued.

### To Whom It May Concern:

As a former employee an AmeriCorps/TechCorps and the current client of MBDP, I would like to testify and advocate for their mission and continuation of all the services that they offer. The impact that MBDP has on its clients' businesses and personal life is and was extremely huge, and it needs to be acknowledged and supported by the State of Vermont.

The administrative and technical services that MBDP provides to their clients on macro and micro level are and were often overseen. Those clients who came to seek help for starting a business do not have a business degree or are technologically savvy, which is very much required these days.

During my employment time, fifteen years ago, as a computer lab coordinator and computer mentor, I served many clienteles who came to seek help for various reasons in addition to starting a business. Together with my MBDP team, we helped them, beside creating a simple business plan, become financially literate, create a simple budget in an Excel sheet and sometimes in Access. MBDP clients had to learn not just how to create a budget but also how to use a software too. In some cases, I helped them install their own software on their machines. Some clients asked for help with creating marketing material for their business, again using a software that they were not skilled for. I taught many grateful clients how to use computer and create their own business logo, first brochures, create first email account and contact their first clients. There were many instructions on security measures and protecting their own business data, but also basic instruction on how to create an email account and communicate with their clients.

There were also many clients from refugee community whom we helped from language literacy to business terminology. Years later, I was stopped on the street by some former refugee clients, who were thankful for all help with the computer literacy, which helped them later start their own business and/or find jobs, connect with their lost family members and friends in their native countries.

Recently, I went back to MBDP to seek help with starting my own business. I knew that MBDP is the best place where I will get a first-hand support for my business plan, financial literacy and budget management. I am still in the startup process and losing their assistance would create a huge burden on my progress. I believe that all their clients would experience huge loss too, not to mention all amazing and supportive employees whose lives will be very much impacted with closing the MBDP.

Throughout my experience with MDBP, I found that their work guided their clientele in order to reduce stress levels during a time when they were occupied with many of the logistics involved with starting a business. The VT economy has benefited tremendously from those who have been able to start their own business. Those who did not choose to start a business were helped in additional ways such as becoming aware of the path and learned how to collect documentation for their business ideas.

I truly hope that MBDP will be fully funded and given the opportunity to continue their great mission.

My name is Robert Gold and I am a 74 year old accomplished Burlington artist with traumatic brain injury. About eight years ago while living in Middlebury, Vocational Rehabilitation recommended CVOEO to me when I wanted to start an art business. I met my business coach Simeon Giegel through CVOEO. Without Simeon and CVOEO's Micro Business Program, I wouldn't be where I am today.

I used to drive to Burlington to meet with Simeon but when it became too much because of mobility issues, Simeon and I would talk over the phone once a month. He has given me guidance in each of my steps to create an art business and has given me ideas that I didn't think of before talking with him. With his guidance I have been able to do things such as create a website of my artwork, run a successful kickstarter for an extreme printmaking project with master printmaker Jon Cone, attend residencies at Vermont Studio Center as well as become a known and established artist in the art community. Some of the many honors I have received in recent vears include being selected as Artist of Distinction by the Chaffee Arts Center in Rutland in 2012, being named as one of the Artists to Watch 2018 by Vermont Artist Guide in 2017, and having several images chosen to be in the Digital Display in The 34th Annual Chelsea International Fine Art Competition at The Agora Gallery in New York City in 2019. When I ran into hard times, Simeon guided me to people or organizations that could help me through it. He has a wealth of knowledge of resources.

Without the help of Simeon and CVOEO's Micro Business Program, I don't know if I would even be an artist today, yet alone so prolific and established. The program is so important to help people with low income have a chance to make something productive of their life. Please continue to fund this essential program.
