Joint Testimony: March 13, 2019

RECOMMENDATION

With respect to S.110 (An act relating to data privacy and consumer protection), the Agency of Digital Services, the Office of the Attorney General, and the Vermont State Archives and Records Administration (Office of the Secretary of State), respectively recommend the following legislation:

On or before January 15, 2020, the Chief Data Officer and Chief Records Officer shall submit to the House Committees on Commerce and Economic Development and on Government Operations and to the Senate Committees on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs and on Government Operations a report concerning the three branches of State government and the management of personally identifiable information, as defined in 9 V.S.A. § 2430(9), as well as street addresses, email addresses, telephone numbers, and demographic information, specifically:

- (1) Federal and state laws, rules and regulations that exempt personally identifiable information from public inspection and copying pursuant to 1 V.S.A. § 317;
- (2) Federal and state laws, rules and regulations that require personally identifiable information to be produced or acquired in the course of State government business;
- (3) Federal and state laws, rules and regulations that specify fees for obtaining personally identifiable information produced or acquired in the course of State government business;
- (4) Federal and state laws, rules and regulations that require personally identifiable information to be shared between branches of State government or between branches and nonstate entities, including municipalities;

- (5) Arrangements or agreements, whether verbal or written, between branches of State government or between branches and nonstate entities, including municipalities, to share personally identifiable information; and

- (6) Recommendations for proposed legislation concerning personally identifiable information and/or the management of personally identifiable information by all three branches of State government.
